Narrative Description:

The Lucien Bridge is located on Stewart Road, where it crosses McCall Creek, on the southern edge of the community of Lucien in Franklin County.

Built in 1938, it is a single-lane, two-span bridge of steel construction, consisting of two identical Pratt through-truss spans, each 151 feet in length and 18 feet in width. Together the spans are 302 feet in length.

The top chords of the structural trusses consist of two channels and one plate connected underneath by small rectangular plates. The posts consist of two channels connected underneath by small rectangular plates, while the hip verticals consist of two angle bars. The bottom chords consist of two rectilinear eyebars. The diagonal members consist of two rectilinear eye-bars, and the counters consist of single cylindrical eye-bars. The metal truss spans are supported beneath by I-beam piers.

Although not regularly maintained, this bridge has not been altered nor has it been damaged.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

The Lucien Bridge, built in 1938, is locally significant under Criterion C in the area of Engineering, because it is one of the most intact surviving examples in Mississippi of a one-lane Pratt through truss bridge. Bridges of this type were commonly built on rural roads throughout Mississippi from around 1900 through the 1930s, but surviving examples are now becoming very rare.

A comprehensive survey of all known truss bridges in the state of Mississippi pre-dating 1953, conducted in 1986, revealed 35 surviving examples of the Pratt through truss type, the oldest being the Tibbee Creek Bridge in Clay County, built in 1896 (listed on the National Register in 1988). By the time these bridges were re-surveyed in 2002, eleven had been demolished, and another six had been abandoned. The continued survival of many others is problematic.

The Lucien Bridge is an intact surviving example of this increasingly rare type of bridge, and it is one of the best examples of the few surviving through truss vehicular bridges in Franklin County.

Verbal Boundary Description

This structure is located in the southwest quarter of Section 1, Township 6 North, Range 5 East, on a county road in Lucien, Franklin County, Mississippi. It consists of two identical 18-foot by 151-foot truss spans with a total length of 302 feet located at UTM coordinates 15-721615-3488440.

Boundary Justification:

The nominated property consists only of the steel truss bridge itself, which is significant as a representative example of its type of bridge construction.
