
DESCRIPTION:

The David Peet farmstead consists of four significant structures within a larger complex of altered and moved buildings. The significant structures are closely spaced. The noncontributing buildings are peripheral to the core structures. The four buildings of note are the farmhouse, barn, silo, and windmill.

- Farmhouse A 1902, frame Queen Anne style house built to the plans of a neighbors house (since razed). The irregular plan house has an octagonal corner tower with a flared, conical roof, a first-floor bay window on one side, Palladian window in the front gable, and a sunburst-decorated open gable above a screened front porch. The only alterations have been enclosure of porches at the rear of the house. The two-story house has a stone basement and maple flooring.
- Barn The original, gable roofed barn has had several additions to where the plan is now L-shaped with some small appendages. The barn has a very large hay loft loaded by a pulley system attached under an extended hay hood. Constructed 1901.
- Silo Wood hoop silo held in tension by metal bands. The silo is to the rear of the barn and attached by a low shed. Constructed 1912.
- 4. Windmill The metal frame, manufactured windmill is still intact and is located between the barn and house. Constructed 1920.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The David Peet farmstead is significant as Wilkin County's best example of the late nineteenth century economic successes enjoyed by area family farmers. The house is one of the most elaborate rural homes in the county. A frame barn and a wood stave silo add to the farmstead. Walter J. Peet came to Wilkin County from Vermont in 1881 and purchased a homestead relinquishment. He taught school in nearby Dakota Territory and farmed in Deerhorn township. In 1902 he replaced his small, original house with the present house. The barn was built at about the same time, as was a granary (now converted into a garage). The house was one of the first rural homes in the area with hot air heat and running water. The wood-hoop silo is fairly uncommon on today's farms. The windmill pump is also seldom seen on modern farms. DAVID N. PEET FARMSTEAD Deerhorn Township Wilkin County, Minn.
