DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Winona Public Library is situated on a corner lot in the central business district of Winona. It is a one storey structure on a high basement. Executed in the Neo-classic mode, principal facades are symmetrical in arrangement with projecting central bays flanked by arcaded windows. The projecting bays are embellished with non-fluted doric columns and pilasters and capped by parapets. The entire cornice line is decorated with modillions; this treatment is also applied to the pediment above the main entry. The building is crowned by a low dome placed at the intersection of the axes described by the central projecting bays.

The building today, appears as it did when built in 1899, with the exception of a small stack area added to the rear of the structure in 1913 (2,962 sq. ft.). Outside dimensions are 85 feet front and 64 feet at the side, with 30 feet additional depth in the stack wing. The top of the outer dome is 56 feet above street level.

The walls of the building are brick, faced with Bedford stone; the entrance steps of native Winona limestone; the columns on the North and East sides are of Georgia Creole marble. The interior woodwork is of quartered oak.

The interior of the building retains original integrity with marble, wood carvings, fresco mural and stained glass dome and roof lites. The main exchange room ceiling rises 30 feet into an inner dome of stained glass by Otto Heinigke. Due to leakage problems, the outer surface of this dome has been covered with tin, preventing light from reaching the inner stained glass surface.

The interior fresco mural, above the main desk in the exchange room, is called the "Light of Learning" and was executed in 1912 by Kenyon Cox as a memorial to Charlotte Prentiss Hayes of Winona lumbering family fame.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Winona Public Library was built and presented to the City of Winona through the generosity of William Harris Laird, one of Winona's affluent and progressive lumber baron-philanthropists. In design it represents a high degree of academicism, an influence on the development of public architecture as promoted through the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893. One such academic trend took the form of Neo-classicism as seen in the Winona Public Library through the interpretation of three prominent architects; Warren Powers Laird, (then dean at the school of Architecture at the University of Pennsylvania), Edgar V. Seeler, and Cass Gilbert.

The Winona Public Library has long been considered as not only an architecturally significant building in the city, but also as a cultural center for the community. This function is enhanced by the provision in the original design for a special gallery for the display of art works, as well as the integretion of murals, statuary, and art glass into the design fabric of the building itself.
