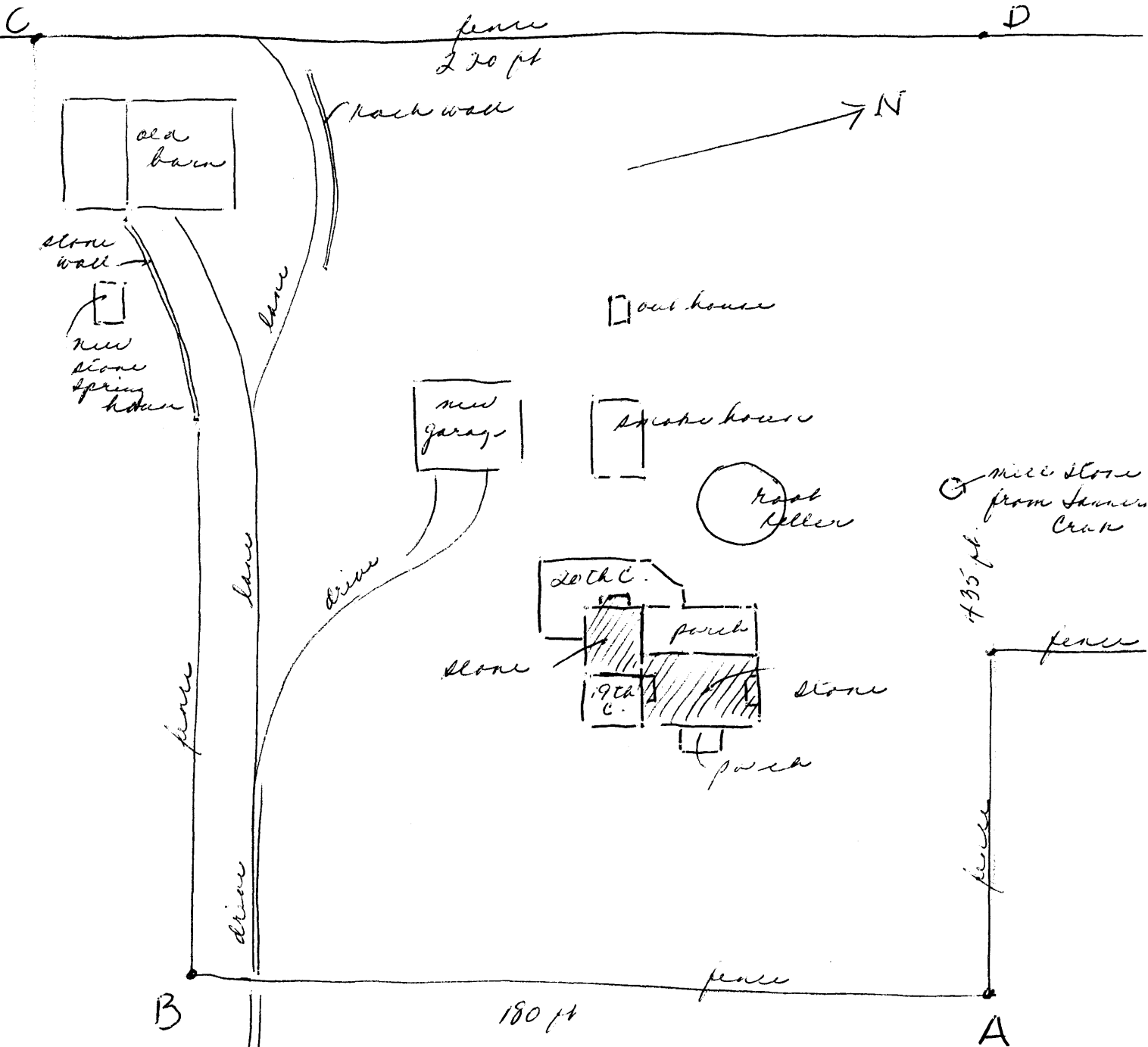

Beginning at A in the NE corner of the yard, ^{at B} then S along fence 180 ft to the SE corner ^{at D}; then W with fence to the E end of the stone wall and swinging out around spring and barn to the fence at C. then N with fence 220 ft to D. then E 435 ft joining fence & with fence to the beginning; containing the house, boat shed, smoke house, out house
