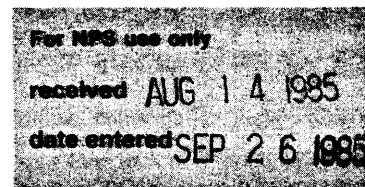

4. Owner: Tony Trujillo, 921 S. Pacific, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation of unknown material; stuccoed adobe walls; terneplate and wood shingle roof; small enclosed eaves with frieze boards; 2/2 double-hung windows with wood surrounds; single door with side lights and transom set in deep reveal; boxed porch posts with molding "capitals," half-timbering and exposed porch rafters. Light brown random ashlar sandstone retaining wall with grey/brown stone cap.
Located across South Pacific from #574 (previous page) a block south of the **Distrito de las Escuelas**.
8. Significance: This house closely follows the Officer's House plan used at Ft. Marcy, Santa Fe and nearby Ft. Union about 1870, with its raised, level foundation, orientation toward the street, symmetrical placement of windows, and Greek Revival Style center hall plan. This centered entry/hall is flanked by two paired rooms with a final, slightly smaller room to the rear. The first floor of this house resembles two other houses (OTR ill. 9, 23) which also copied the military type about 1875, although here the gabled half story was omitted. The porch, added about 1915, uses a typical local amalgamation of the Bungalow and Tudor Styles.
