DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Located in the center of Raymond along the tracks of the Boston and Maine Railroad, the station constitutes a finely-preserved example of late 19th century railroad architecture. It consists of the station proper and attached roofed-over areas on either side which are supported by square posts with chamfered corners and sawn braces. The one-story station is rectangular in plan with central bay projections on the northwest and southeast elevations and a bow projection on the southwest facade. Clapboards sheathe the wall surface from the brick foundation to the window sills; the remaining wall treatment is of imbricated scalloped shingles. Sawn braces support the eaves which are embellished by exposed rafter tails. The hip roof is punctuated by a brick chimney stack on the northwest elevation and by the semaphore signaling equipment on the southeast. Door and window heads are molded. The stenciled window boxes are a recent addition.

Two related buildings are located behind the station and west of the tracks and are in excellent condition. One is a section car house which is now used to store a fire engine belonging to the historical society. The other is a small waiting station which was moved from East Candia, New Hampshire, and is used as a tool shed. Near the station's west corner is a brass bell cast in 1859 by Henry N. Hooper and Company. The bell once hung in the Raymond Town Hall which was destroyed in the fire of 1892.

The interior of the depot is equally well-preserved and retains many original features. The baggage room, now used for museum space, is separated from the central ticket area by the original gates. The ticket office has its ticket windows and semaphore signaling equipment intact. In the waiting room there is much of the original seating.

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In a time when many railroad stations are threatened with demolition or suffer from severe structural deterioration, the Raymond depot is outstanding not only because of its well-preserved condition, but as a typical example of late 19th century railroad architecture. Almost in its exact original condition, it maintains a reference to the town's earlier history.

The railroad was extremely important to Raymond's economy. It brought in raw materials for the manufacture of shoes and other products and shipped out finished goods from local shops and mills. It was also vital in transporting the town's summer tourists who came annually and stayed in Raymond's many fine boarding houses and inns.

This is the third in a succession of railway depots on this site. The Portsmouth and Concord Railroad constructed the first in 1850, but it burned in 1878. A new station was constructed soon after and was destroyed in 1892, in a fire which leveled most of the center of Raymond. This structure was built in 1893 and two years later the property was purchased by the Boston and Maine Railroad.
