The following documentation supports a boundary increase and a boundary decrease for the Greer Downtown Historic District. The district was listed in the National Register in 1997, with additional documentation approved in 2004. At the time of listing, the boundary line for the district was drawn through the contributing buildings at 221-223 Trade Street, 115-117 East Poinsett Street, 119 East Poinsett Street, and 129 East Poinsett Street, as well as the non-contributing building at 108 Trade Street, leaving portions of the rear of each building outside the district. These buildings should have been included in their entirety within the original boundary, and the exclusion of portions of them was done in error. At 112 Trade Street, the boundary line passes through this contributing building by virtue of an addition built after the date of listing. This boundary increase therefore amends the descriptions of each of the above buildings in Section 7 and increases the boundary to ensure all buildings are included in their entirety. The two-story brick building at 104 North Main Street (#40) was listed as a contributing property in the original nomination for the district. This building was demolished in 2019. The boundary decrease amends the district boundary to exclude the former site of this building. A new historic district map reflects the changes to the boundary and is keyed to the inventory.

Contributing Buildings

5) **112 Trade Street** (ca. 1920): A two-story brick building with a built-up roof with parapet and cornice. There are four pairs of windows with glazed terra cotta surrounds, entablature, and coping. A glass block transom marks a sidewalk entrance to the upstairs, which is an annex to the United Carolina Bank at 116 Trade Street. A one-story brick addition was constructed at the rear of the northern half of the building ca. 2007.

19) **221-223 Trade Street** (ca. 1935): A one-story brick building with a built-up roof with parapet; metal and plate glass storefronts, and the original pressed-metal ceiling. The southern half of the building, at 221 Trade Street, extends onto the adjacent property at the rear of the building, to the edge of the alley extending south from Victoria Street.

32) **115-117 East Poinsett Street** (ca. 1920): A two-story brick building with built-up roof with parapet wall and six bays on the second floor. A one-story brick rear addition was constructed on the northeast end of the building between 1930 and 1951. Another brick addition, built along the full length of the east elevation, infilled the gap between 115-117 East Poinsett and 119 East Poinsett. This building was historically the Elmore Hotel and Café.

33) **119 East Poinsett Street** (ca. 1935): A one-story brick building with a built-up roof and a pressedmetal ceiling. A new storefront was installed ca. 2016. There is a small, one-story addition at the rear of the building which is stepped down in height from the main structure.

35) **129 East Poinsett Street** (ca. 1915, ca. 1925): A one-story brick building with a three-bay front façade featuring three corbeled brick courses and a stepped parapet with paneled pedestals and stone coping. The front (south) half of the building was constructed between 1911 and 1922. Through the

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1920s the property housed auto sales and service. A service garage was added onto the north end of the building between 1922 and 1930. The one-story garage addition is constructed of brick and features a steel-truss roof. The garage addition is double the width of the original building.

Non-Contributing Building

42) **108 Trade Street** (ca. 1920): A two-story brick building with a recessed storefront; four pairs, horizontal 2 over 2 windows at second level. In 1922 this building housed two shops at the front and a movie theater at the rear of the building. Between 1930 and 1951, a large two-story brick addition was constructed on the rear of the building.
