Mr. John Gill, his wife, and children, Lewis, Martha, and Helen were the first occupants.
Mr. Gill owned a number of slaves who made the bricks used in the front part of the house. Evidence of the kiln for making the bricks is still found in the field in front of the house. The walls in this section are two bricks thick. There are chair rails in both front rooms and in the hall.
The house was built facing the old Crab Orchard Road which at that time ran thru' the hollow in front of the house.
Dave Thompson bought the farm from John Gill , Alex Walker owned the farm after Mr. Thompson and later sold it to James I. Watkins, who on December 21, 1917 sold it to James H. Dalton.

When Mr. and Mrs. Dalton moved to this farm there was a log cabin used originally by the slaves in the southwest corner of the yard.

The house is situated on a knoll overlooking many of the 362 acres comprising this farm.


