

Description

House has not been restored. Since date of survey, the ell chimney has been removed. Window sash has not been replaced. Most of the chinking is out. Some of the logs are deteriorating. Two stone flues were added to rear ell.

House retains its tongue and groove board partition walls and enclosed corner stair. The first floor ceiling joists and exposed second floor boards all have beaded edges. Nicely arched fireplace openings with tooled voussoirs.

Two contemporary residences have been built near by on the farm; new boundary was drawn to exclude them (attached).

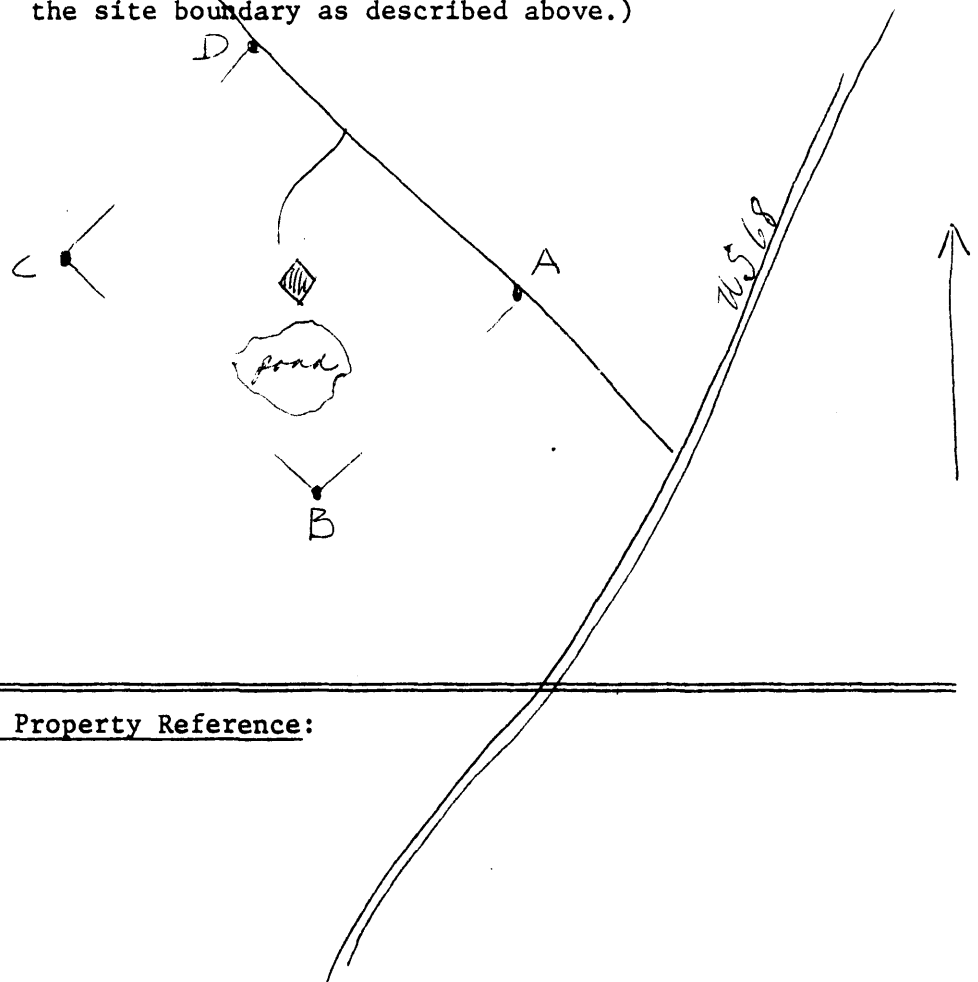

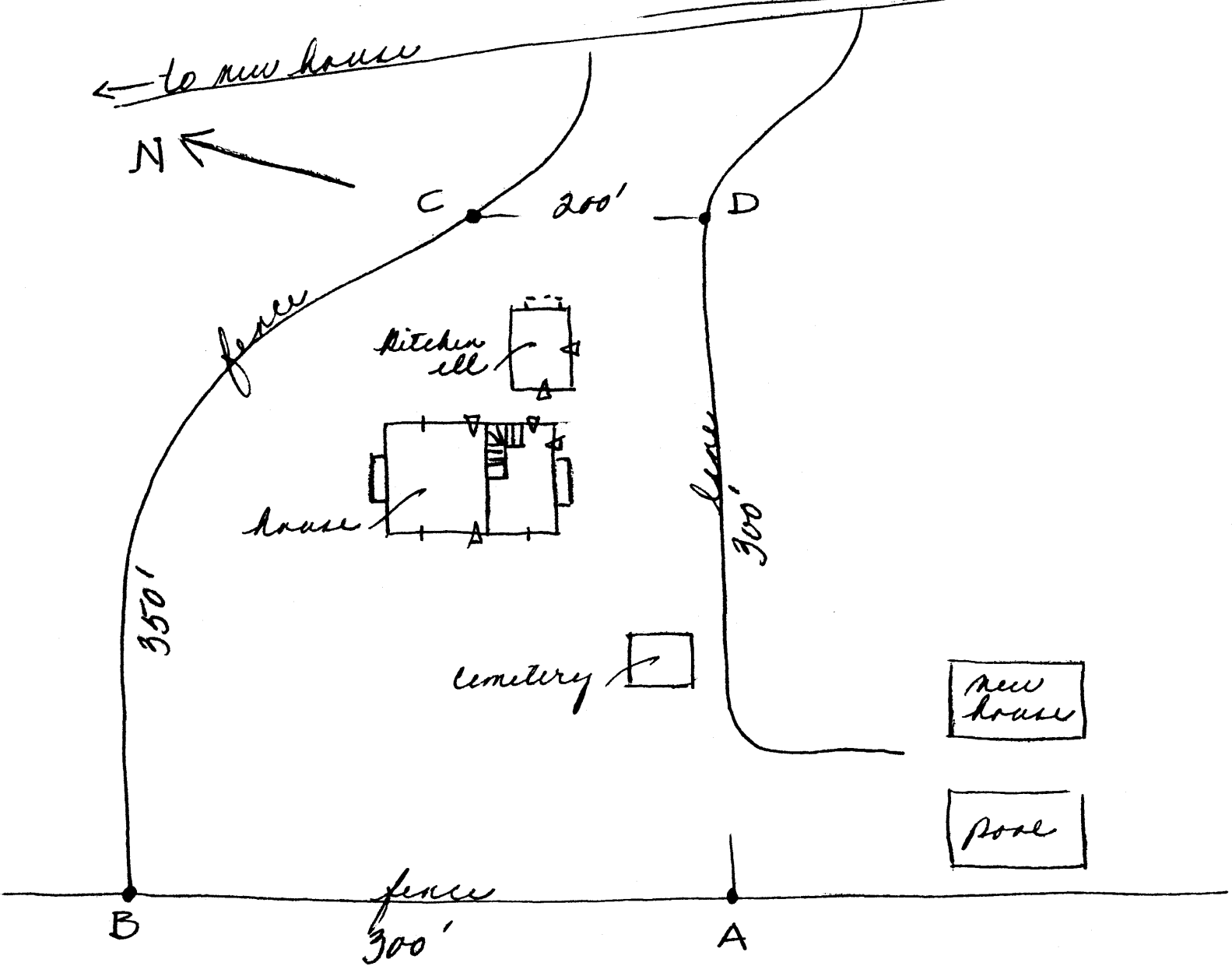
Sketch of Site Plan (Showing outbuildings, structures, landscape features and the site boundary as described above.)
