

Description

The Water Pump Station and Water Tower were constructed in the winter of 1941-1942 by the Del E. Webb Construction Company. They are located on the orner of "B" and 12th Streets. The complex is surrounded by a chain link fence. The Water Pump Station is designed within the Minimal Traditional stylistic theme. Both the building and the Water Tower represent the Military Facility property type. The Pump Station and Water Tower retain sufficient integrity of design, materials, workmanship, setting, and association. They are both currently in use.

The Pump Station is an irregular shaped, one-story building of cast-in-place concrete construction. The building measures 60 by 60 feet overall. The building is covered with a flat roof of cast-in-place construction with an unadorned flat parapet. The cast-in-place walls of the building have been painted. Windows penetrate most wall planes and they are steel awning windows with multiple lites. A primary entrance is located centrally at the west end and consists of a paired metal door with four lites per leaf. An addition to the south and west of the building was completed in 1951 and is compatible with the building's original design and materials. Despite some window and door modifications, the building retains sufficient integrity to convey its historic identity.

The Water Tower is a 127 feet in high structure constructed of steel. The 250,000 gallon steel water tank is nearly spherical in shape. It is supported by eight equally spaced steel struts, each connected by four vertical cross braced panels. A catwalk extends around the perimeter of the water tank base.

Statement of Significance

The Water Pump Station and Water Tower are significant under Criteria A under the areas of significance of Community Planning and Development and Military. The Water Pump Station and Water Tower are significant for their association with the initial development and construction efforts at Williams Air Force Base. They are exemplary of the original utility infrastructure that was developed to support Williams Field. They are representative of the historic context "Williams Field Base Facilities Development, 1941 to 1944." Built by the Del E. Webb Construction Company, the Water Pump Station and Water Tower represent the Military Facility property type.

The location and drilling of a water well was one of the first construction projects undertaken at the Williams Field. Drilling began in early July 1941. By November 1941, the 250,000 water tank and the 127 foot tall Water Tower were completed and construction on the cast-in-place concrete Water Pump Station was underway. The building was completed in early January 1942. Stylistically sympathetic additions, also built of cast-in-place concrete, were constructed to the south and the west of the Water Pump Station in 1951. Yost and Gardener, Engineers, from Phoenix, designed the addition. The Water Pump Station and Water Tower continue to function in their original capacity, and together illustrate one of the vital historic components of Williams Air Force Base.

Statement of Significance (continued)

The Water Pump Station and Water Tower are good illustrations of the Military Facility property type and retain integrity of design, materials, workmanship, and location. They convey the physical characteristics of the property type, including overall design, use of materials and method of construction, which help to demonstrate the property's specialized function. The structures visually provide an association with the initial development of the base and its significant role during World War II. The Water Pump Station and Water Tower possess the associative quality that connects them to the history of Williams Air Force Base. The property clearly conveys its function as a water supply facility and therefore as an integral component of the base's original World War II-era infrastructure.

Amendment to Water Pump Station and Water Tower, part of the Multiple Property Listing for Historic Resources of Williams Air Force Base, Arizona. The Water Pump Station and Water Tower were listed on the National Register of Historic Places on June 19, 1995.

Williams Air Force Base is listed as the "City or Town" on the nomination form. However, Williams Air Force Base was closed in 1993 and the property is now within the city limits of Mesa.

The Arizona SHPO requests the Keeper to amend the nomination form to list "Mesa" as the City or Town where the Water Pump Station and Water Tower are located.
