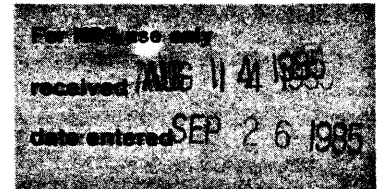

4. Owner: Synod of the Southwest, 10 E. Roanoke, Suite 31, Phoenix, Az. 85004.
7. Description: Rusticated sandstone foundation; brick walls; wood shingles on roof and in porch gable; moderate overhang with exposed beams (porch only) and rafters; 9/1, 12/1 and wood casement windows with projecting brick sills, two three-part Palladian-like window groups; brick porch piers with caps supporting wood lintel with molding string courses.
8. Significance: This is a first-rate example of the late stages of the local Hipped Box type. While most turn of the century Hipped Boxes had boxed in eaves and lumberyard classic columns, those built after 1910, such as this one, adopted exposed rafters and beams, along with stout porch piers from the Bungalow Style. The Eighth Street Extension, where this house stands, is discussed with Building #1511.

Boundary: Unplatted. Eastern portion of an unnumbered lot as defined by a city zoning boundary and recorded on Map 4.
