20. Significance **Constructed in a center-passage plan, this building like the Staley House (Ck-270), has an original ell, which incorporates two chambers into an L-shaped plan. The interior detailing is of the Federal period and includes three fine gougework mantels. The house was built by John Hill prior to 1808, but it has been named for its most famous owner, surveyor, Thomas Hart.**
