The Hawkes Pharmacy Building is located in the center of the York Beach commercial district. The surrounding buildings are closely spaced to each other and of similar scale and period. Virtually all of the nearby buildings, however, have been extensively altered with non-historic materials. Only The Atlantic House hotel directly across the street retains much of its historic fabric.

Constructed of wood, the Hawkes Pharmacy building is a full two stories high due to the steeply pitched gable roofs on front (northeast) and side elevations. These gables are part of the elaborate Tudor style detailing that ornaments the upper floor level. The eaves of each gable are embellished with vergeboard and finials (the tops of which are missing.) The second floor walls at this level feature flush-board siding ornamented with decorative half-timber designs. The second floor windows are either paired or in groups of three and have double hung sash consisting of diamond paned lights over a single pane. In the center of the principal elevation is a recessed bay with a segmental arched opening. A balcony with square posts and railing is supported on decorative brackets in front of this bay.

The first floor is sheathed with wood shingles and almost without fenestration except for the storefront on the facade fronting Main Street. This facade has a central entrance providing access to the upper floor and symmetrically arranged shopfronts on either side. These consist of doorways flanked by angular-shaped oriel windows. Above each door and large display window are two rows of small square lights. The original symmetry of this facade was restored in 1990 when a doorway was rearranged and a missing oriel window reconstructed.

On the rear (southwest) the store was never ornamented in the Tudor Style. The first floor had two doors and a shed-roof addition. Two original gable roof dormers were located on the slope of the roof above, but these were shingled in a plain fashion. In the 1990 rennovations the addition was removed and the dormers rebuilt to receive large wooden fire escapes and a doorway for emergency egress. At the same time, a new foundation was dug and a garage door below grade was added to the southeast side.

The interior of the building suffered a major fire in the 1940s and contained no original features. Both floors were extensively rennovated for shops and hotel rooms in 1990.

Hawkes Pharmacy is an architecturally significant example of the Tudor Revival style, and one of only two historic commercial buildings in the York Beach business district which has not been significantly altered. Built in 1902 by Dr. Wilson Hawkes, it was erected at a time when the York Beach area was prospering as one of the major summer resorts on the Maine coast. That prosperity is evident in the unusual attention given to ornamental features for this small commercial building. It is eligible for listing in the Regtister under criterion C.

The Town of York historically has two major concentrations of summer colony architecture: York Harbor and York Beach. The former was the location of the summer homes built by the most wealthy visitors, while the latter was habituated by people of more moderate means. Each community also had its own commercial district and York Beach contained a number of hotels and commercial establishments oriented toward summer resort entertainment. The Hawkes Pharmacy occupied a prominent location in the center of this small summer community.

Dr. Wilson Hawkes established a practise in York Harbor in 1872. His arrival from western Maine coincided with the early development of this community as a summer resort. First acquiring an old mansion, he later built a pharmacy and art studio in the harbor to serve the wealthy summer visitors. In May, 1899, Dr. Hawkes purchased the York Beach pharmacy of L.K.Mead & Co. His son Ralph, who was about to graduate from Dartmouth, took over the management of the new buisiness.

The success of the York Beach pharmacy enabled father and son to purchase a lot opposite the Atlantic House hotel and erect a new building. In October, 1901, they hired local architect Fred C. Watson to design the building, which was to contain two stores. E.W. Baker was the contractor. In the south half to the store was the Hawkes Pharmacy operated by son Ralph. The other half was leased to D.H.Stacy & Son, a dry goods merchant, who resided on the second floor.

Architect Fred Watson moved from New York City in 1899 and worked for local architect-builder E.B.Blaisdell. Watson had learned the carpentry trade from his father and his drafting skills at a normal school in Boston. After working for New York architect Frank Lent for one year, he established his own practise in the city for three years. Watson worked for Blaisdell for two years before opening his own office in April, 1901, specializing in "seashore buildings." He later relocated to Bar Harbor. The other known buildings by this important York architect are all summer homes. Hawkes Pharmacy is the only example of non-residential work that has been identified.

Ralph W. Hawkes operated a pharmacy here until the 1940s. A fire at about that time did major damage to the interior. While the surrounding buildings have either been destroyed or undergone major alterations with non-historic materials, this building survived with its major exterior features intact. Hawkes Pharmacy was extensively rennovated in 1990, which included the construction of missing features on the principal facade. The ground floor continues to be used for shops and there are rooms to rent on the second floor.


