Yours of the 16th inst with enclosures have been rec'd, contents noted.

All bills contracted for since Sep^r 21st with the exception of one or two small bills have been settled. I have bills amounting to \$20,470.00 contracted for by Mr Lippincott previous to his leaving the Co which are not settled. My instructions have been such that I could not settle them. My neighbors Lackawanna & Lehigh Companies are doing just nothing at all by way of shipping coal. From appearances I should judge that all of them have not shipped 1500 tons of coal since 1st January. The Lack Co have shipped but one cargo since 1st. I do not wonder they are not shipping for no man who is a judge of coal would take more than one cargo of them. I never in the five years of my experience in the coal business saw such poor coal as they have been getting this winter. I am at present furnishing the Central R R Co with coal, I am receiving a large amount of coal daily, which keeps me very busy. It is a hard matter to keep the cars unloaded. What has become of the 1700 tons

Ship for St. Louis coal? I commenced stacking
St. Louis coal Saturday for the first. I am getting
large piles of coal on stock. I hope it will not
be long ere I shall have orders for a 1000 tons
of coal for day I would much rather ship all
coal and from day to day than to throw it on
stock. I do not like the idea of stacking so much
coal here, for it adds greatly to my expenses.
