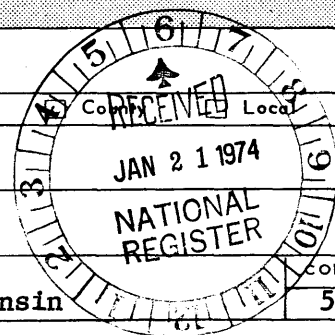

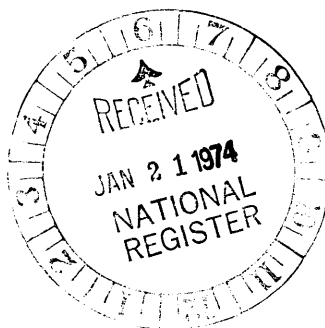

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Both the exterior and interior of this two-story factory building are in good condition. On the exterior, alterations over the years have changed the appearance of the structure to some extent, but most of its original character remains. It is of primarily timber construction with "cream city" brick exterior walls. On the facade are molded masonry details, terra cotta inlays, large cut stones and several iron components for a truly unique appearance.

Most of the interior space is unfinished, just as originally constructed. The front rooms have been remodeled for office space, but have been vacant for some time and have not been maintained. Only the east third of the structure is now occupied (automobile tire service).

The building is situated at the south end of the Central Business District at the southeast intersection of South 9th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, two major vehicular routes. It covers about 4,800 square feet of land area. The factory should feel a direct effect from the now progressing urban renewal project, just one block away. This effect could be in the direction of preservation if work would begin soon. But, it could also move in the direction of demolition once land values start to increase as a result of urban renewal.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Jung Carriage Factory building is one of the City's most important 19th Century commercial and manufacturing structures. It was built on Pennsylvania Avenue, then the center of the City's commercial district, for Jacob Jung, an early Sheboygan industrialist, for the manufacture of horsedrawn carriages, wagons and sleighs. Many of the vehicles produced in the building are now on display at the Jung Carriage Museum in Greenbush. After 1890 the business was expanded to include a painting and interior decorating shop.

The unique facade design, showing some influence of the Richardsonian Romanesque style, is one of a kind in Sheboygan. The identity of the architect is, unfortunately, as yet unknown.
