Summary

Located at the northeast corner of U.S. Highway 63 and Echo Lane, the Sherman Bates House is a one-and-a-half story fieldstone residence constructed in 1940 in a vernacular interpretation of the Tudor Revival style. The essentially rectangular-plan building rests upon a stone foundation and the walls are constructed of random-sized, rough-cut native stones that are laid without courses and are pointed with beaded mortar. More carefully cut stones are used in trimming the porch arches and wall corners. A composition-shingled, side-gable roof with two projecting gables on the front elevation covers the structure. The house is approximately 42' wide by 48' deep.

Elaboration

The front, or southern, elevation features a large exterior stone chimney constructed in the manner of the walls with the corners having a more coursed appearance. The chimney is positioned just east of center; to the west of the chimney are the parallel projecting gables utilized for the front porch and entrance. The western gable is taller and wider while the eastern gable accents the single-leaf entrance. The stone and concrete porch is raised substantially above the ground and is accessed by twelve poured concrete steps from the west that lead to a 6' by 6' landing and four more steps to another 6' by 6' landing before turning and stepping up to the 18' by 10' porch.

Another single-leaf entrance is placed near the northwestern corner on the western elevation, which also has a single-leaf entrance into the basement. All of the elevations are fenestrated by an assortment of six-over-one and one-over-one wood windows.

The interior of the house was originally floored throughout with 1"by 2" tongue-and-groove flooring. It remains visible in the dining room and living room; however, tile has been installed in the kitchen, workroom, and bathrooms (upstairs and downstairs), and all three bedrooms have been carpeted.

A large outbuilding, 20 feet square, is located to the northeast of the residence and is used as a garage and storeroom. The frame constructed building is covered with flagstone veneer on three elevations and contains a modern, standard-size folding garage door in the center of the northern elevation with vertical board siding on the surrounding wall surface.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The first three owners of the house, Sherman Bates, Sidney Kelley, and R. N. Clay, were all successful businessmen in Hardy. Bates owned the Magnolia Oil Company (later Mobil Oil) from 1937 to 1979, except for the World War II years when Sherman served in the Navy.

The location of the Bates House on U.S. Highway 63 east of Forty Islands Creek, the traditional eastern boundary of Hardy, is indicative of the shift in residential growth to the outlying areas and the reliance upon the automobile for commuting to work. It was one of about five houses built at this time.

The Sherman Bates House is being nominated as part of the "Historic and Architectural Resources of Hardy" multiple-property nomination under **Criterion C with local significance** as an excellent example of a 1940 vernacular interpretation of the Tudor Revival style of architecture in the post-Depression growth era of Hardy. It is distinguished from other stone residences in Hardy by the use of three different types of native fieldstone with beaded mortar, the prominent exterior chimney, and the juxtaposition of two different sizes of gables to cover the raised front porch








