The Klindt House is one of a very few houses in the Second Empire style erected (or remaining) in Davenport, and appears to be a very late example of the style. The enclosed porch and center pediment suggest the late date, but other features, such as the crested mansard and pedimented dormers, are typical of the style during its major period (1870's, early 1880's). The house is impressively sited or a high, rising lot with stone retaining wall. The large carriage house/garage is also worthy of note.	ECTURE

SIGNIFICANCE

This was the residence of George Klindt, partner in a locally prominent brewery at the turn of the century. Because the brewery building remains, the significance of this building is diminished somewhat. This was the third of three houses along this street built for partners of the brewery company - 826 Marquette for George Mengel and 834 for Henry Klindt.

DESCRIPTION

George Klindt, son of Henry Klindt, became a partner in the Mengel & Klindt Brewery in 1891. George succeeded his father in the company who had originally become a partner with George Mengel in the brewery in 1876. The brewery was originally known as the Littig Brewery or Eagle Brewery. In 1894 four breweries including Mengel & Klindt merged to form the Davenport Malting Co. George Klindt became the consolidated operations secretary-treasurer. Davenport Malting reached its peak in 1916 with nearly 100 employees. Statewide prohibition closed down the company the same year.
