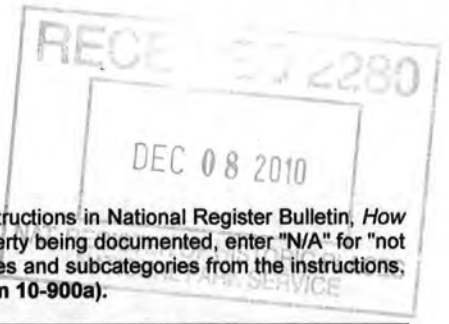

Summary Paragraph

The Louis J. and Gertrude Lee Bohn House is a two-story, Pueblo Revival inspired farmhouse built in 1928-1929. The house has an irregular L-shaped plan and a flat roof hidden behind a horizontal parapet with blunted wall and roof

corners. The foundation is brick and the walls are stucco-covered adobe. The Bohn House is located on the corner of 7th Street and Northern Avenue, adjacent to the prestigious Orangewood Addition in North Central Phoenix. It is an excellent representation of the farmhouse property type detailed in the associated Multiple Property Documentation Form, "North Central Phoenix Farmhouses and Rural Estate Homes, 1895-1959," and is a unique example of the once popular Pueblo Revival Style, which is covered in the same MPDF.

Narrative Description

The Louis J. and Gertrude Lee Bohn House is located at 750 East Northern Avenue in North Central Phoenix. It is a residential property consisting of one building, located at the southwest corner of a large condominium complex. Set back from 7th Street ninety-two feet the property is reached via an automated security gate system that provides access to the condominium complex. The house is a 2,300 square-foot, irregular L-shaped building consisting of a main two-story structure and two single story wings. The Bohn House is surrounded with a well-maintained grassy area on the front (west) and south sides, and condominium parking on the east and north. A meandering four-foot wall surrounds the house, rear driveway, and green space, delineating the private space from the shared and public areas.

The house is two stories tall at the main structure, stepping down to one story for the wings. The walls are stucco-sheathed adobe extending vertically to a horizontal parapet shaped to suggest the handmade feel of adobe architecture. Wall and roof corners are blunted and the roof is flat and hidden behind the parapets. Facing west towards 7th Street, the front façade is centered on subtle Spanish Colonial Revival influenced elements. These include a bay in a central two-story section with an arched entrance doorway and dual arched windows above the entrance. This latter feature contains a minimal Churrigueresque column separating the windows and complemented by the ironwork of a balconet.

Symmetrically placed, tripled single-hung windows on the lower and upper floors flank the central bay of the front facade. The windows, in turn, are flanked by buttresses, which, in conjunction with the down stepping façade, demarcate the change from main structure to north and south wings. Paired, single-hung windows also provide symmetry to the front façade of the wings.

A large fireplace chimney dominates the middle of the south façade of the south wing, accompanied by—left to right—a single-hung window and a smaller stove chimney. The rear façade of the south wing is entered via a five-light French door flanked by asymmetrically sized, single-hung windows. Double French doors also provide access to the south wing from a rear patio.

A large fireplace chimney that extends beyond the second floor roof dominates the rear façade of the main structure. An alcove is built into the center of the chimney, and a small single-hung window resides just to the chimney's left. To the right of the chimney are French doors providing access to the main structure: a ten-light and two paired five-light doors. The north façade of the north wing has single and paired single-hung windows. A wrought iron fence encloses the back patio separating it from the driveway. Extending west from the wing is a two-car garage, with a slab door and small single hung window. Slab doors provide access from the west wall and from within the rear porch.

Two balconies are located over the north and south wings. The north balcony is the larger of the two, extending from the north wing to over the garage via a small wrought iron gate. It is accessed from paired five-light French doors on the north façade of the second floor of the main structure. Three windows—an aluminum sliding, a four-light steel casement, and a small, single hung window—are located on the east façade. Above the south wing, the balcony is reached through a paired set of five-light French doors.

Integrity

Since its construction in 1929, the Bohn House has occupied a prominent location at the corner of 7th Street and Northern Avenue, immediately northeast of the Orangewood subdivision. Though the front door is located on the west façade facing 7th Street, the main entrance is now from the rear, entering from the driveway. Three-light, steel casement windows were replaced with contemporary wood double-hung windows, which, though different from the originals, are in keeping with the style. Although there have been repairs, modifications, and updates made to the house, the exterior remains essentially unaltered, except for the introduction of a short wall in front of the structure, delineating the boundary of the property from a common area. Most of the changes to the property occurred when the original farming property was converted to apartments in 1992.

The period of significance is from 1929, when the house was completed, to 1959, when the rural area was annexed by the City of Phoenix.

Statement of Significance Summary Paragraph (provide a summary paragraph that includes level of significance and applicable criteria)

The Louis J. and Gertrude Lee Bohn House is a farmhouse designed in the Pueblo Revival Style. It is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C, "Architecture" because it is a rare embodiment of the distinctive characteristics of Pueblo Revival Style architecture that developed in North Central Phoenix between 1895 and 1959 as detailed in the Multiple Property Documentation Form, "North Central Phoenix Farmhouses and Rural Estates Homes, 1895-1959."

Narrative Statement of Significance (provide at least one paragraph for each area of significance)

The Louis J. and Gertrude Lee Bohn House is significant under Criterion C as a rare example of farmhouses as described in the MPDF "North Central Phoenix Farmhouses and Rural Estate Homes, 1895-1959," because it is one of the best examples in North Central Phoenix of this property type, designed in Pueblo Revival Style. Characteristic of this style, the house possesses stucco-sheathed, adobe walls that extend vertically to a horizontal parapet curved to suggest the handmade feel of adobe architecture. Wall and roof corners are blunted and the roof is flat and hidden behind the parapets. The house is an exemplary example of the Pueblo Revival Style and the use of adobe construction, is well

maintained, and retains almost all of its original exterior architectural integrity. The setting has been somewhat compromised by adjacent recent development, but the landscaping helps preserve the rural feel.

Developmental History

A graduate of the University of Kansas with a degree in engineering, Louis J. Bohn moved to Phoenix in 1908. In 1909, while working in Phoenix as an electrical engineer, Louis purchased a twenty-four-acre parcel on which he planted the land with citrus trees. He eventually began to use the property as a weekend retreat and bestowed it with the moniker El Domingo Rancho (Sunday Ranch in Spanish). After marrying Gertrude Lee in 1927, the couple began the design of an adobe home on the southwest corner of El Domingo Rancho. Building began in 1928 with adobe bricks created from soil extracted on site. The house was completed the following year.

Louis owned and operated an electrical business in Phoenix until 1934 and then worked as an electrical contractor until his retirement in 1945. Active in the thriving Valley-wide citrus industry for many years, Louis was also a charter member of the Arizona Citrus Growers Association. The Bohn family owned and occupied the house from its construction until the El Domingo Rancho was sold for the development of an apartment complex in 1991. As part of the development, the house designed by Louis and Gertrude was preserved in the corner of the former El Domingo Rancho for use as office space. In 2004, the apartments and house were converted to condominiums.

Verbal Boundary Description (describe the boundaries of the property)

The boundaries of the property include the house, the rear driveway, and the greens space to the south and west of the house, as delineated by a low, stucco-covered block wall. This area currently possesses a historic preservation overlay managed by the City of Phoenix Historic Preservation Office.

Boundary Justification (explain why the boundaries were selected)

The original approximately property was subdivided and eventually developed into a large condominium complex. As part of the complex design, the Bohn House was retained as Unit 1. In 2005, in cooperation with the owner of Unit 1 and the complex homeowners association, the City of Phoenix placed a historic preservation overlay on the house, the driveway east of the house, and the green space on the south and west. The boundaries of this nomination mirror the boundaries of the City of Phoenix historic preservation overlay.

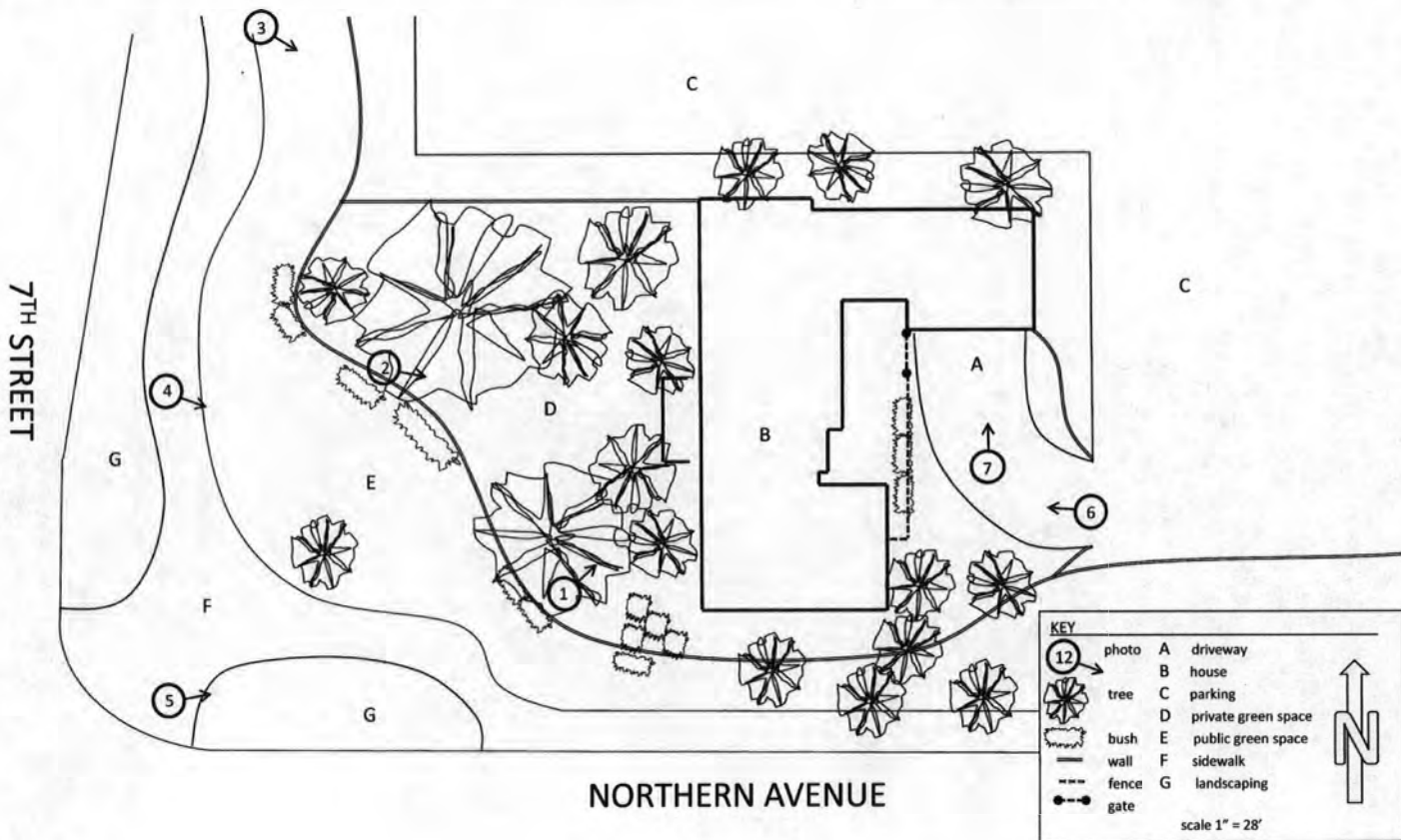

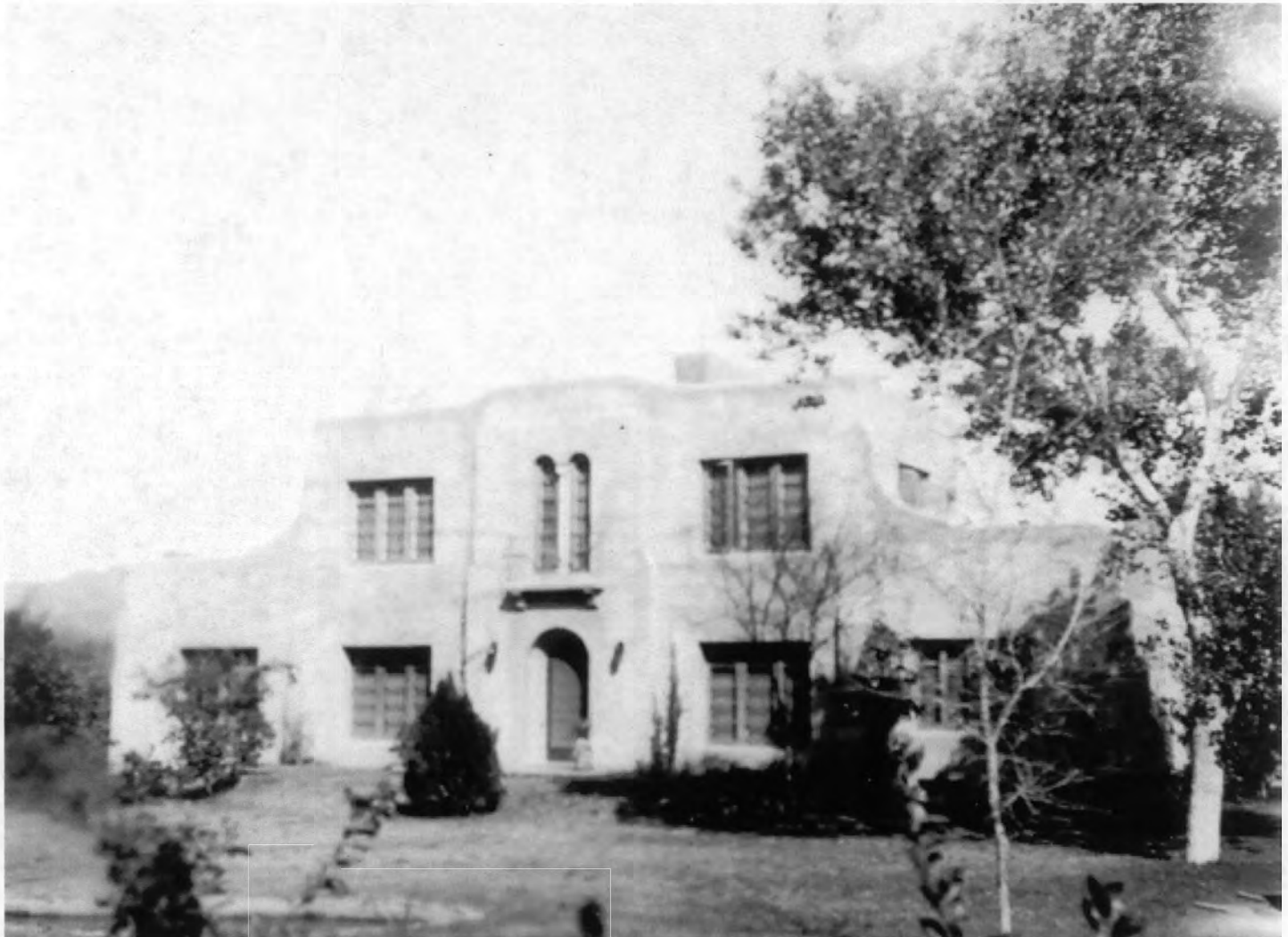


Figure 3. Louis J. and Gertrude Lee Bohn House, front facade recently completed, ca. 1929. Courtesy of the City of Phoenix Historic Preservation Office.

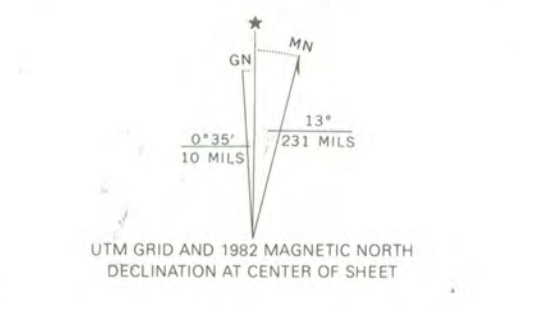
