Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Shawnee Drive Overpass .1 mile northwest of I-35 crossing Seventh Street Trafficway is a steel open spandrel arch measuring 94 feet in length. It has a width of 23.6 feet since it was widened in 1976. The bridge consists of four essential parts; a roadway deck, the deck supports or spandrel framing and two arch rings which spring from reinforced concrete abutements.

The structure was rebuilt in 1976 by Continental Steel and Conveyor, Inc. at a cost of \$149,792. A new wider deck was placed on the bridge, the substructure was painted and new walls and parapets were put in place.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Shawnee Drive Overpass .1 mile northwest of I-35 crossing Seventh Street Trafficway in Kansas City, Kansas retains a high degree of its integrity of location, design, setting, materials, feeling and association. It embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type and method of construction no longer being used, namely a reinforced concrete deck supported by a riveted steel arch ring and spandrel posts and may yield information important to the history of engineering.

In use, the steel open spandrel arch or stiffened arch rib bridge acts much as a stiffened suspension bridge would if it were reversed in position. The redesigned former tension members now act in compression.

The design in its crude form began gradually to be introduced soon after the construction of metallic arches in the late 18th century but it was not until the late 19th century that the style became prominent in the United States.

The Shawnee Overpass represents later reinforcements of metal arch bridge construction and its combination with reinforced concrete elements. It is the only known example in Kansas.

Construction plans for the Shawnee Drive Overpass show a date of 1932-1934 which corresponds to the time of the building of the Seventh Street Trafficway. These plans also indicate that Concrete Engineering Company and Kansas City Structural Steel were involved in building the bridge for the city.

The nominated property shall consist of a rectangle created by the $23\frac{1}{2}$ foot width and 94 foot length of the structure crossing Seventh Street Trafficway on Shawnee Drive in Kansas City, Wyandotte County, Kansas. That portion of Seventh Street Trafficway passing underneath the bridge is not included. The bridge is located in the SW4, NW4, NW_{4}^{1} , NE_{4}^{1} , T11S, S27, R25E.
