

7. Description:

The Spears-Craig House (BO-351) is located on the west side of the Lexington Road (S.R. 33--a.k.a. Shakertown Road). The residence was historically associated with a large and prosperous farm, however was divided and most original acreage is now under separate ownership from the main residence. Within this nomination are two contributing buildings, the main residence and meat house. Additional acreage was not included.

1.) Facing east, toward the Shakertown Road, the c. 1826 main residence (contributing building) is a two-story, brick masonry center-passage plan with Greek Revival influences, having an American bond pattern, rear two-story ell and a side gable roof clad with asphalt shingles. Sitting on a cut stone foundation, the residence features two interior end and one central interior brick chimneys, all of brick. The symmetrical front facade is divided by five bays, with the central glass and wood entry topped with a single pane transom and fronted by a modern screen door, flanked on either side by original 2/2 sash windows with bevelled exterior surrounds and stone sills. Windows on the rear ell are also original, 6/6 sash with similar surrounds. A central one-story porch expands across three bays, supported by round wood columns capped with lonic treatments. The two story rear ell features a central interior brick chimney, weatherboard siding in the gable end, and windows on each facade. Two porches, on the south side and rear (west) have entries into the ell. The rear porch is an early-to mid-twentieth century addition, extending one-story in length the one bay room has a gable end (with weatherboard siding) a brick exterior, and continuous sash windows enclosing the porch.

The interior central hall has an open-string stair with a plain wood, square newel post, wood balusters and a square ramped rail. Each room on either side of the central hall feature high stepped baseboards, single doors with two-panels, a slight pointed head trim with plain profile over each doorway, and plain square corner blocks. Central-placed fireplaces on each end wall are fronted by typical mantels with Greek Revival motifs and topped with tooled stove flat arches. The second story of the front block features the same floor plan. Details to the rear ell are unavailable due to no access.

2.) Behind (southwest) of the main residence is a c. 1826 log meat house (contributing building), oriented north-south. The building features a front gable roof with standing seam metal covering and weatherboard siding in the gable ends. A vertical plank entry door is centered on the front (east) facade while a single pane window is found on each side wall. The exterior logs are separated by rows of chinking and are square notched.

8. Statement of Significance:

The Spears-Craig House (BO-351) is located on the west side of State Route 33 (the Lexington and Danville Road) along the northern outskirts of Danville in central Boyle County. Nominated as part of a Multiple Property Listing entitled "Historic and Architectural Resources of Boyle County, Kentucky" the residence meets National Register of Historic Places Criterion C and is a locally significant example of a traditional hall-parlor plan influenced by the Greek Revival style in Boyle County. The size of the house and quality of construction, including finely cut, dry-laid limestone foundation, suggests that the owners enjoyed a certain prosperity, but had no intention of declaring their wealth in the appearance of their residence. The restrained, five-bay facade and simple Greek Revival interior are vernacular expressions of the Greek Revival that contribute to the understanding in the range of Greek Revival architecture in Boyle County during the early to mid-nineteenth century.

The property is significant within the theme "Domestic Architecture in Boyle County, 1780-1945" and has a period of significance of c. 1826, the approximate date of construction. The residence was constructed by the Spears family (as was the non-existing, associated stone barn) (Murray-Wooley, 1983). The property currently maintains good historic integrity through its retention of original materials, design, craftsmanship and style.

10. Geographical Data:

Verbal Boundary Description:

Located on the west side of S.R. 33 (the Lexington Road), the nominated property sits away from the main road, fronted by a stand of mature trees. The boundary of the nominated property is the area indicated by dotted lines within Parcel 79 of the accompanying Boyle County Property Identification Map 45. Located in the Boyle County Property Valuation Administration Office, the tax map has a scale of 1" = 600'.

Boundary Justification:

The boundaries include the main residence and an associated log meat house, the only remaining buildings historically associated with the property and maintaining a level of historic integrity. The remaining portion of Parcel 79 was excluded from the nomination as it does not contribute to criterion considerations.
