### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Blackwater Presbyterian Church is a frame chapel, oriented roughly north-south, with a south entry. Over-all dimensions are 35 feet by 30 feet. There are two windows on both the east and west sides. In the south elevation, there is one window above the double doors.

On the west side, the building is sheathed in clapboards, which are beaded on their lower edges and feathered to form lap joints on their ends. Such clapboards, no more than five feet long, generally were made of cypress. Above and below the two windows on the west side are patches of new clapboarding, indicating that taller windows once were here.

The windowless north wall is sheathed in smooth, square-edged clapboards similar to the ones on the south elevation. The east wall clapboards are rougher, and exhibit circular saw marks.

Exterior trim on all four side windows consists of a beaded casing trimmed with an ovolo. Greek mouldings of simple style trim the insides of these windows; the corner blocks are formed from mitred sections of mouldings. There are shutters on the windows.

The portico on the south doorway is supported by a bracket in Victorian style, with carpenter gothic trim in the pediment, which is repeated above the south window.

Inside, the church displays the various periods of its construction and use. On the north wall is a marble plaque with the date of construction, 1767, and the date of rebuilding, 1893. The gallery, which runs along the south end of the church, is supported by four posts with lambs-tongue chamfers. In the southeast corner of the church is a stairway to the gallery, with a closet below it.

The pews are simple, apparently locally made, of indeterminate but early age. Two ornate Victorian stoves provide heat, being vented through chimneys in the centers of the east and west walls. The ceiling is made of beaded, natural-finish, pine, tonque-in-groove boards. The chancel is a raised platform on the north end, faced with the same tongue-in-groove boards that are found in the ceiling. A pulpit, of walnut and cherry, stands on the front edge of this platform. Music is provided by a pump organ.

Oil lamps are mounted around the edge of the church, and tin candle sconces are attached to the gallery posts.

The present floor is wide pine boards, but legend states that there is a brick floor below.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Blackwater Presbyterian Church, built in 1767, is the oldest Presbyterian church building in southern Delaware. Its first pastor was Charles Tennent, son of a famous Presbyterian family. On its west wall, the church preserves a significant specimen of early Delaware cypress clapboard sheathing.

During 1763, the pulpit of Buckingham Presbyterian Church in Berlin, Maryland, was filled by Charles Tennent, whose father had founded the "Log College," predecessor of Princeton. On his evangelizing tours, Tennent visited Baltimore Hundred and helped to start Blackwater Church. The Presbytery of Lewes minutes indicate that the Blackwater Church was accepted into the Presbytery on May 3, 1763. The first elders were Joseph Miller, Ebenezer Evans, John Evans, William Tunnell, John Aydelotte, Thomas Harnig, and Thomas Wingate.

Tennent conducted services in members' homes at Blackwater on alternate Sundays until the church building was erected. Until 1840, Blackwater and Buckingham continued to be affiliated. In 1856, some members withdrew to form the present Ocean View Presbyterian Church. Others later broke away to form the church at Frankford.

After 1856, Blackwater declined. The two daughter churches, in more populous areas, gained membership and vitality. At the Presbytery meeting in October 1921, the congregational organization was abolished and the Frankford church was designated trustee of the property.

The Tunnells, one of the founding families of the church, have held their annual reunions in the building since 1927. Through their efforts, a brick wall has been built around the churchyard, a new roof has been installed, and the grounds have been maintained. Maintenance is provided through a trust agreement with the Sussex Trust Company of Laurel.

The church is currently being repaired by the Colonel Armwell Long Chapter, DAR. In the course of repairs, the date 1860 was found scratched in the plaster, apparently while the plaster was wet. A painted stencil design was found during the same repair work.
