



Beginning at a point on the north side of Four and Twelve Mile Road, being 1900' southeast of Four Mile Pike, proceed northeast 200', crossing small creek, then proceed southeast 200', then proceed southwest 200', crossing small creek, to Four and Twelve Mile Road. Then proceed northwest 200' along said road to the point of origin. Boundaries include stone dwelling and domestic yard area.
