### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Farmers and Citizens Supply Company Block, constructed around 1906, is a two-story, brick, commercial building with flat roof, corbeled brick cornice, several brick chimneys and windows with lintels. The main facade has cast-iron storefront windows with decorative pilasters and several entrances on the first level and eight four-over-four windows on the second level. The north-east corner of the first level of the building has a recessed entrance behind a mitered corner with a single column. The entrance has its original tile flooring and marble doorstep. The south facade has a corbeled brick cornice and five windows with lintels on the second level, a stepped brick stringcourse, a door and two windows. The interior of the building consists of three sections corresponding to the three commercial establishments. Most of the first floor interior has been replaced with the exception of the windows, doors, and original wood stairway leading to the second floor. The second floor retains its original wood floors, ceiling, doors, mantels, and plaster walls.

The Farmers and Citizens Supply Company Block is adjacent to the northern edge of the South Main Street Historic District. However, between the district and this building are a 1930s county courthouse and several nonhistoric commercial buildings. Across Main Street is the antebellum Eagle Tavern, already listed in the National Register. Attached to the north side of the building is a nonhistoric commercial structure. Further to the north is a mixture of historic and nonhistoric residential and commercial buildings.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

#### Significance

The Farmers and Citizens Supply Company Block is significant in the area of architecture and commerce.

In terms of <u>architecture</u>, the building is significant primarily for its exterior which represents a good example of early 20th-century vernacular commercial architecture in small towns in Georgia. Its architectural features associated with the simple commercial style are the brick construction, corbeled cornice, cast-iron storefront windows, and flat roof. An unusual feature is the mitered corner entrance. The Farmers and Supply Company Block is one of the few remaining historic vernacular commercial buildings in Watkinsville, and as such it meets National Register Criteria C.

The property is important in the area of <u>commerce</u> for its association with the Farmers and Citizens Supply Company that was created in 1906 for a wholesale and retail dry goods, grocery, and general supply business. The two-story brick building housed the Farmers Supply Company, Dr. W.C. Hodges Office and Drugstore, and the Farmers and Citizens Bank. After 1908 the building served additional commercial purposes including a barber shop, a mortuary, skating rink, and restaurant. The Farmers and Citizens Supply Company Block has been significant in the early 20th century commercial development of Watkinsville as the site of exchange of goods and services for the community and surrounding county residents. It was one of the largest such enterprises in Watkinsville and the building is the largest intact historic commercial structure in town. Because of its association with events that have made a contribution to the broad patterns of Watkinsville's commercial history, the property meets National Register Criteria A.




