

E. Kuehn, a "pattern maker" according to the directory, erected his double house in about 1864. This part of the city was near-downtown in the second half of the 19th Century and was predominately residential. Judging from the institutions in the neighborhood and the Kuehn surname, this was an ethnic German enclave from mid-century.
