Land originally part of Nathaniel Gist tract, son of explorer Christopher Gist linked to house in Montgomery Co. "F. Matthews" 1877 Atlas Rezin is believed to have built a brick house in Montgomery Co. See MM-6.**

20. Significance **Nathaniel Gist sold a tract of land near Stoner Creek to David Gist, who built this stone house in 1786. The imposing, symmetrical three-bay facade encloses a hall-parlor plan. The later flanking wings are not discordant elements. The house appears to be related to a similar one in Montgomery Co.**
