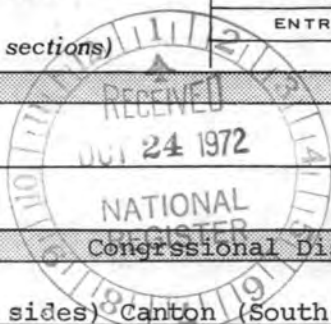

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The designated area comprises some 500 acres and contains some 160 noteworthy and supportive buildings and six notable landscaped areas. Both vernacular and sophisticated examples of architectural styles, from the late eighteenth century to the early twentieth century, are represented. The vernacular includes workers' housing of the "Cape Cod Cottage" type and simplified versions of the Greek Revival and Gothic Revival styles; stone metalworking and assembly shops; and small frame retail shops, often converted from housing of the mid-nineteenth century. Sophisticated architecture came first in the 1850s: Queset (1854, probably A.J. Downing-A.J. Davis, "Gothic Villa" style) and Langwater (1859, George Snell, French Mansard style). Architect-designed buildings of the 1860s down to World War I abound: Oliver Ames II house (1862, George Snell, French Mansard style), Unity Church (1873-75, John Ames Mitchell, English Gothic), Unity Church Parsonage (1877-79, Ware and Van Brunt, Stick-Queen Anne Style); Easton High School (1895-96, Carl Fehmer, Georgian Revival); Spring Hill (1893-95, Carl Fehmer, French Chateau); Gate Lodge of the Oliver Ames III estate (1894, Rotch and Tilden, English half-timbered); Post Office-Savings Bank (1904, Shepley, Rutan, and Coolidge, Richardson Romanesque); Louis and Mary Frothingham House - Town Offices (1912, Guy Lowell, Georgian Revival);

Amid the above are five buildings designed by Henry Hobson Richardson for members of the Ames family: Oliver Ames Free Library (1877-83); Oakes Ames Memorial Hall (1879-81); Gate Lodge of Langwater (1880-81); Old Colony Railroad Station (1881-84); and the Gardener's Cottage of Langwater (1884).

Frederick Law Olmsted provided landscape designs for the surroundings of Oakes Ames Memorial Hall (1881-82) and created in front of it a public square with a Cairn in its center (1882-84 and altered slightly c. 1945); the grounds of the Railroad Station (1883-84); the grounds of Langwater (1886-87); the grounds of the Oliver Ames III estate (1891-93); the grounds of Queset (1891-92); and the grounds of Spring Hill (1895-96).

Most of the buildings are in excellent condition. The Railroad Station is in process of restoration by the local Historical Society and a preservation grant is being applied for for Memorial Hall, owned by the town.

South side of Canton Street to the west boundary of the cemetery.

West: The west boundary of the cemetery and then generally by west (back) lot lines of properties adjacent to Main Street to the northwest corner of property facing Main and Lincoln Streets, except for property containing "Queset" which has a 600 foot set back.

North: North lot lines of properties on north side of Lincoln Street to and including lot opposite Reardon Lane.

South: South side of Lincoln street and Main Streets by approximately 150 foot set back or south (back) lot lines, whichever is less, except for Oliver Ames III property ("Sheep Pastures") which has a 1000 foot set back.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

North Easton historic district is physically, functionally, and aesthetically an extremely cohesive settlement. This unity doubtless stems from the fact that the village was created largely by one source: A resident manufacturing family (Ames) that carried out its business (shovels and tools), housed its workers and itself within a small compass, and provided itself and its workers with elaborate amenities. Industrial and transportation buildings form a core, around which lie two belts: an inner one of workers' housing, smaller residences, and civic and commercial buildings, and an outer one of large estates.

North Easton is exceptional among many such paternalistic industrial communities in the quality of its architecture, landscape design and town plan. Henry Hobson Richardson is here represented by an assemblage of five examples of his architecture, each one of which has a distinct civic or private function related to that of neighboring buildings or areas. Three of his works are either subtly complemented (Old Colony Railroad Station and Gate Lodge of Langwater) or dramatized (Oakes Ames Memorial Hall) by Frederick Law Olmsted's landscape designs. Olmsted also landscaped four of the five estates of the Ames family that form a buffer zone between the village of North Easton and its mix-use, unplanned neighbors to the east, southeast and northwest.

Except for the closing-down of the Ames family industry, North Easton is essentially unchanged from the early twentieth century and is a viable community today.
