Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The "Norumbega" Carriage House of Camden, Maine, built in, or shortly after, 1886, is a remarkable building in the Queen Anne style, complementing the main house ("Norumbega", N.R. 7/12/74).

The $2\frac{1}{2}$ -story carriage house is of field-stone and frame construction with an L-shaped plan, cross-gabled roofs, shingled siding (except where field-stone is exposed), and a tall external tower attached to the east corner of the building. This tower is cylindrical with a conical roof; its lower half is stone as far up as the cornice of the carriage house, and above that point it is framed with shingled siding. Just below the bracketed cornice of the tower are positioned several windows of varying shape (6/6 and 1/1).

The facade faces north-west and features an arched barn doorway in stone, above which is a second-story arched bay with double-doors, flanked by small circular windows. Two other ground-level entrances are present, a hooded one to the extreme left end of the facade and another to the right of carriage entrance.

The southeast side of the building contains 2/2 fenestration and, as in the facade, has two half-timbered triangular pediments at half-story level.

An extension of the building to the southwest (which creates the L-shaped plan), contains a second barn door facing northeast. Above this carriage entrance is a double doorway with two 28-light windows.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Although originally part of the "Norumbega" estate of telegraph magnate and inventor Joseph B. Stearns, the Carriage House has for some time been separately owned and as such is being nominated individually.

Designed, like Norumbega, by Arthur B. Jennings of New York City, the building reflects the same imaginative approach. Evidently a romantic in his creative inspiration, he also designed the St. Lawrence Wright Memorial Church on Munjoy Hill in Portland (N.R. 10/ 1/79) in which many of the same stylistic details appear.

Originally containing grooms' quarters the building is now being rehabilitated for use as a residence in its entirety.

The Norumbega Carriage House is unique in its design and reflects the opulence and variety of taste exhibited by wealthy Maine summer residents in the early years of the resort development.
