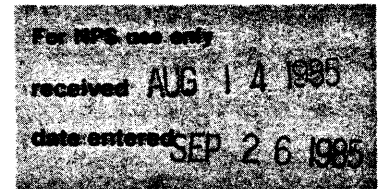

4. Owner: Rudolfo Roybal, 921 Chavez, Las Vegas, New Mexico.
7. Description: Stucco over stone rubble footing; stuccoed adobe walls; wood shingle roof; small overhang; 2/2, 1/1 double-hung windows with wood surrounds and (some) molding cornices; three single doors; lathe-turned columns, cut-out brackets, stickwork railing and frieze. Located in a residential area one block south of the **Arroyo Gabonito** and the Old Town Residential District.
8. Significance: A well-preserved New Mexico Vernacular house with an unusually well detailed porch. The original single file portion, built about 1890, has three doors (one to each of three rooms?) in traditional fashion. Its leveled foundation and the emphasis of the front porch were more recent Anglo innovations. The rear addition came sometime before 1930. Note the typical gable door.
