18. Description <b>The Bannon house is a substantial 2½ story brick structure with a broad, front porch extended eaves, a large gable, heavy brackets beneath the cornice, and a tile roof. Bands of buff brick appear at the tops of the window openings and continue across the facades. This house is similar in appearance to JF-157, located on an adjoining tract of land and built for another member of the Bannon Family.</b>		36. Date <b>6 August 1979</b>	
19. History <b>In 1910 Patrick Bannon, Jr. bought this tract of land and probably built the house soon after. By 1916 his residence was listed in the city directory as "Buechel", the location of this house. Bannon was a son of Patrick Bannon, Sr. who came from Ireland and settled in Louisville about 1852. The senior Bannon was a plasterer who later became a manufacturer of terra cotta, vitrified pipe, and brick. (SEE NEXT PAGE)</b>		37. Revision Dates _____ 38. Staff Review _____	
20. Significance <b>The Bannon house is an excellent example of early twentieth century domestic architecture with Arts and Crafts details. It and its neighbor, JF-157, were most likely designed by the same architect. Both houses are similar to work done by J.J. Gaffney or the firms of Joseph and Joseph or D.X. Murphy and Bro.
