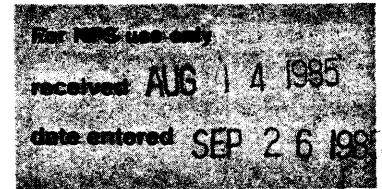

4. Owner: Martin Gabaldon, 2203 New Mexico Ave. Las Vegas,
N.M.
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation; stuccoed adobe walls; ter-
neplate (rear) wood shingle (front) roofs; small overhangs with
exposed rafters; tongue and groove in gables, door in side gable;
1/1 double-hung windows (rear), 3/1, 4/1 double-hung windows
(front); single door; porch railing, lathe-turned columns and
exposed rafters. Located in a residential area one block NW of
the Old Town Residential District.
8. Significance: The piecemeal accretion of New Mexico Vernacular
buildings is especially clear in this house with two discrete
stages of construction. The traditional single file of rooms at
the rear (twice the length of the front section) dates to the
nineteenth century. About 1910, a front addition modernized the
house. Its broader massing, vertical paned windows and exposed
rafters are drawn from the Bungalow Style. The Queen Anne style
porch columns had been out of use for ten years in New Town,
which is not unusual since folk buildings frequently combined
unrelated styles and salvaged materials.
