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#### **DESCRIPTION:**

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The Scott Creek Stone Arch Bridge is a two span masonry stone arch bridge located at Flatbranch Road over Scott Creek. Built in 1898 the two span bridge is approximately twelve feet wide, 48 feet long, with spans sixteen feet wide. The bridge is abandoned and located in a wooded area a short distance away from the current road.

The Scott Creek Stone Arch Bridge is being nominated under National Register criterion C for its engineering significance in Grundy County. The bridge was constructed circa 1898 by R. M. Crick, of Coalmont for the sum of \$620. The Scott Creek Stone Arch Bridge is one of three stone arch bridges built by R. M. Crick being nominated to the National Register (see #1, #2). The Scott Creek bridge is the oldest of three bridges and is an excellent example of the stone masonry work done by R. M. Crick. The bridge is one of only a few extant stone bridges in Tennessee. The Scott Creek Bridge is in good condition and has retained its integrity.
