## Representation in Existing Surveys

Description Typical of the best commercial structures constructed in the warehouse and distributing area near Assembly Street, this building was built circa 1916. The brick structure has three stories built over a full basement. It features a flat roof, stringcourses which delineate the three floors, decorative marble and stone insets and arched windows on the first and third floors.

The interior of each floor is 70' x 80', with 15' ceilings supported by wooden columns. The full basement contains a natural spring which rises and drains in its northwest corner.

Tradition indicates that the Hinson Feed and Seed Store is located on the Significance site of an early campground used by farmers when they brought their produce to market on Assembly Street. The campground was located on the site because of three natural springs in the area; one of these natural springs is still located in the basement of Hinson Feed and Seed Store.

The building itself was constructed by 1916 by B. B. Kirkland to serve the Kirkland Distributing Company, a firm which dealt in flour, grain and hay. It later housed a variety of businesses until 1966 when it became Hinson Feed and Seed Company, a feed and seed distributing company which also operates the Columbia Hatchery.
