
Bracketed hipped roof extends above center glass panelled door w/ flanking floor length side light.


Large subdivided window 2nd floor above entrance.


Paired brackets below projecting side bays; flower boxes below center windows. String course across wall above & small scale paired windows w/ broad surround & dividing panel in attic gable.

Triple window below broad gable of dormer w/ splayed corner walls above entrance.









SITING, BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION, AND RELATED STRUCTURES:


House sited at center down steep slope of 115' x 153' irregular lot; walkways north & south, drive to 2 car garage near north-east corner.
± one acre.
SURROUNDING ENVIRONMENT: Urban
SIGNIFICANCE:
More restrained in detail than is usual, this home conforms to the larger version of Craftsman design. The typical brackets appear below roof & overhang & the clipped gable is used in moderation.
Designed for Charles T. Droste Esq., the house was featured in "The American Architect" of July 6, 1910, Vol. XCVIII, No. 1802. Hilda Fenn Van Antwerp who collaborated with her husband in the design of this residence was the daughter of the well known watercolor artist, Harry Fenn. For more on Harry Fenn, see form on #208 No. Mountain Ave.
The interior of this house has survived with virtually no changes. Woodwork on the first floor still retains its natural finish. The front stairway which extends to the third floor features the use of bent wood.




