


FORM 1½ story saltbox, 5-bay symmetrical facade CONST. DATE c. 1855

STATEMENT

This well-preserved little house is a very good example of Davenport's early residential architecture, built in the locally rare saltbox form. The combination of brick walls and stone slabs to span openings is a traditional building method, excellently illustrated on this house.
