

### **SIGNIFICANCE**

The 1921 Main Street Bridge on Colorado Highway 115, in Florence, meets the registration requirements under Criterion A in the area of Transportation and under Criterion C in the area of Engineering as set forth in the *Highway Bridges in Colorado*, Multiple Property Documentation Form. The period of significance begins in 1921 with the completion of the bridge and extends through its historic use to 1952, a date fifty-years-of-age in keeping with National Register criteria.

Named after the daughter of town founder James McCandless, Florence was established in 1872 along the tracks of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad. The town eventually became an important supply point for the outlying region and a center for oil refining and ore reduction for the nearby drilling and mining districts. Its location on both Coal and 0ak creeks meant that numerous small scale bridges were necessary to carry city streets over the two streams. Built of wood, these early structures required frequent repairs to keep them functional. When floods on both streams damaged or destroyed several of the bridges in 1908 and again in 1915, the city opted to replace them with more substantial concrete structures.

Although the existing Main Street Bridge over Coal Creek had weathered both the 1908 and 1915 floods, by 1921 it was deteriorating. In August, the Florence Board of Aldermen instructed City Engineer A.B. McFall to draft plans for a new concrete structure. Three weeks later, McFall presented plans for two different designs, one featuring a 45 foot deck width, the other an 80 foot width. The town solicited competitive bids for both, and on September 21 received proposals from eight bridge contractors: J.T. Westfall, H.M. Fox. Wood & Perkins, William Robbins. Shields & Kimmell, all of Florence; the Midland Bridge & Construction Company of Kansas City; the Monarch Engineering Company of Denver; and the Pueblo Bridge & Construction Company of Pueblo.

The aldermen wanted to award the contract to low bidders Shields & Kimmell, but they could not agree about the bridge's width. The issue became a source of considerable contention throughout Florence, and after deadlocking on several votes, the board put the question to an informal vote of the citizenry. In November, the townspeople approved a compromise 68 foot wide structure. Shields & Kimmell were hired to build it for \$9,452 plus 75 cents per foot of sub-structural piling. Completed early the following January, the Main Street Bridge continues to function in place, in essentially unaltered condition, as an important component of Colorado Highway 115 and the principal stream crossing in Florence.

### **Engineering**

After the turn of the 20th century, the preferred alternative to the steel truss for short and medium span vehicular bridges was generally considered to be the concrete arch. More solid under traffic and better resistant to flooding, it was also valued as more aesthetically refined

than the starkly functional steel truss. Although the Highway Commission formulated state standards for concrete arch bridges as early as the 1910s, the Colorado Highway Department never built many, preferring to use steel and concrete beam construction.

While the most prolific concrete bridge builder in Colorado was the Pueblo Bridge Company, and the most common arch type was the filled spandrel Luten arch, other contractors built non-Luten filled arches during the early years of the 20th century. A small number of these structures remain in use today. Locally designed, and built with local funds, the small scale Main Street Bridge in Florence is ornamented by the use of recessed rectangular panels in its solid concrete guardrails. Located in a prominent location, the intact structure remains in use as a well preserved example of a small scale concrete filled spandrel arch.
