Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Kaiser's building is a small, two-story, cream brick commercial building, approximately 20 x 90 feet, with its long axis perpendicular to Sixth Street. In 1928, a new south facade was erected, based on drawings by Frank J. Hoffman of Racine. This facade consists of a single unit, which contains display windows and a central entrance on street level, with three windows on the second story. The entire south facade, with the exception of the decorative panels described below, is covered by glazed pink terra cotta panels. Pilasters at both the east and west edge of this facade feature fluting that ends in stylized volutes below the cornice. Above the copper awning cover over the display windows is an incised polychromatic terra cotta panel with geometric motif. Above the second story windows are three identical incised polychromatic terra cotta panels, with a stylized Deco sunrise motif. There is a shallow dentil cornice along the top of the building.

The addition of an electrical neon sigh hung perpendicular to the building by Trauger's Jewelry Store has been the only change from the original appearance of the 1928 south facade. The Kaiser's Building is flanked by two-and three-story brick commercial buildings, many of which are wider and thus more substantial in appearance.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The glazed polychromatic terra cotta facade of Kaiser's is one of the most colorful and finest examples of commercial Art Deco architecture in downtown Racine. The combination of mechanized, geometric banding with lanquid, stylized panels illustrates the lively variety of patterns characteristic of the style. Designed by locallyprominent architect, Frank J. Hoffman, it has remained unaltered since its erection in 1928-29.

Kaiser's is of local significance because it is one of the few unaltered examples of commercial Art Deco architecture left in downtown Racine, as well as being a good example of Frank J. Hoffman's architectural style. Hoffman, who purchased Edmund Funston's Racine architectural practice in 1924, exhibited a tendency toward Art Deco/Moderne characteristics in an era when catering to conservative tastes was more profitable. He displayed a command of color and detail that complemented the scale of his various works.

DESCRIPTION (cont.)

Features of the interior are contemporary in nature, with no clues to the Art Decoera appearance. The simple open space of the showroom is lined with display cases along the east, west, and rear walls; a partition wall screens the work area and store room to the rear. A staircase in the rear provides access to the office space on the second story, which was originally used as an apartment. The basement-level storage area extends under the sidewalk outside.

No photographs or descriptive material could be located relative to the appearance of the building prior to the 1929 remodeling. The building at 218 Sixth Street was labeled as a hardware store on the 1887 Sandborn Insurance Map, and as a store on the 1894 and 1908 maps.
