DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The North Bedford Historic District is comprised of approximately 400 structures. It is characterized by a residential use pattern and reflects the popular architectural styles of the nineteenth century. The Federal, Greek Revival, and Italianate periods predominate, especially in the southern section, while there are an increasing number of examples of later styles such as the Second Empire, Queen Anne and Colonial Revival in the northern section. It is located directly north of the Central New Bedford Historic District (potential NR), which is flanked by the New Bedford Historic District (NR) and the County Street Historic District (NR). The North Bedford Historic District is unique in its concentration of modest workers housing interspersed with more elaborate manufacturers' homes.

The majority of the houses are two to two and one half stories in height, and are of wood frame construction with clapboard or shingle siding. The Federal houses retain windows set just below the roof line with six over six sashes, and tall narrow chimneys at the building ends. The longest side of these dwellings are parallel with the street. Greek Revival homes, which are the most common in the district, have either six over six or two over two sashes. The Greek Revival dwellings retain wide friezes and corner boards, and many contain elaborate bracketing at the gable and roof line. These homes present their gable ends to the street. The Italianate homes in the neighborhood are typical of a later period in the district's development when money was more abundant and dwellings were a slightly larger scale. They too are typified by roof bracketing, but also by nearly square overall dimensions and a quadra-gabled roof line. Often there is a cupola at the roof peak.

The district originally was characterized by a dense single family use pattern. The density of the dwellings remain. In general, the lots in the district average 5,000 square feet, and the buildings front directly on the sidewalks. However, through alterations to the buildings, the use pattern has changed to a combination of single family, two family, and multi-family dwellings.

The district extends from an open area (created through the urban renewal process) on the south to the City Common on the north, and from the crest of a hill (defined generally by County Street) on the west to the downtown connector and another urban renewal area on the east. It is a long and narrow area which covers the eastern portion of a hillside which forms the western bank of the Acushnet River, the north section of the district was known once as Acushnet Heights.

The condition of the buildings in this neighborhood has remained good. Today, the district may be characterized as a moderate to low income and mixed race area; it is partially because income has been limited that no major alterations to the exterior elements have been made. The paint colors presently found in the district are many and varied, and are not always appropriate to the type and style of the buildings. Although there appears to be a considerable need for paint and minor maintenance in the district, the buildings are sound and retain architectural features original to their styles.

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There are very few intrusions of newer buildings or non-residential uses in the neighborhood. Of the nearly 400 buildings in the district, the few which are not devoted to residential purposes contain either religious or governmental uses. Two major structures of this type are St. Lawrence's Church, a granite Gothic structure built in 1870, and the Massachusetts National Guard Armory on Sycamore Street. There are no federally owned properties in the district.

The following is a description of representative building types in the district:

The John Walden House (1830) located at 35 Hilman Street, at the corner of State Street, (#58-184 - Photo #7) is characteristic of Federal period houses within the district. It is two and one half stories in height with a ridge roof and end chimneys. Its symmetrical five bay facade is focused on the entrance which has a semi-circular pan and is framed by Doric columns supporting a projecting triangular pediment. Windows have six/six sash and simple lintels and sills. The house is sheathed with shingles and sits on a granite foundation. Typical of this period, it is set on a small lot with approximately 50' frontage and only 10' from the sidewalk. This same building form is echoed at 65 Walden Street (#58-175 Photo #17) where it has been covered with asbestos siding, at 39 Foster Street (58 - 367 - Photo #18) where a two story portico has been added and at 38 Foster Street (#58-374).

The George Cannon House (1856) at 34 Willis Street, on the corner of Pleasant Street, (#65-132 - Photo #20) is a typical Greek Revival house. It is of side hall plan, faces gable end to the street, and is two and one half stories in height with a ridge roof. The three bay facade is framed by paneled pilasters, a wide entablature and projecting cornice. Windows have six/six sash and simple frames. The house is sheathed with narrow clapboards and sits on a rather high granite foundation. Like the John Walden House, its lot is small and it is set close to the street. Similar buildings are located at 103 Summer Street, (#58-258) where the cornice is bracketted and there is a one story columned portico, at 90 Walden Street, (#58-77) where it is only one and one half stories in height, and at 75 Mill Street (#58-364) where there is an arched window in the gable.

The Joseph Knowles House (1855) at 546 County Street (#58-339 - Photo #2) is one of the finest and least altered examples of the Italianate style. It is two stories in height with a low hipped roof broken on each elevation by a central cross gable. The projecting cornice is emphasized by a combination of modillions and paired, carved brackets. The facade has a central entrance with an elaborate enclosed porch capped with a turned balustrade. A stylized Palladian window is located above this and a small window consisting of paired round arched sections lights the gable. These central elements are flanked at both the first and

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second stories by paired windows with four/four sash. All windows have bracketed sills and boldly projecting cornices. The house is sheathed with match boarding on its facade and clapboards on its other elevations. Other features include a belvedere and a bay window on the north elevation. Once again, the lot is small and the house set close to the street. Similar houses are found at 899 Pleasant Street (#58-302 Photo #23) at 549 County Street (#58-337 Photo #8) with a one story porch across the facade) and at 695 County Street (#65-358 Photo #22).

The Paul Howland House (1877) at 91 State Street (#65-129 Photo #5) represents the Second Empire style. It is two stories in height with a mansard roof and a heavily projecting bracketed cornice. The mansard is lit by pedimented dormers. The three bay facade is given a strong vertical emphasis by a second story oriel which continues above the cornice as a tower element. The central entrance is protected by a one story porch with bracketed supports which extends southward. The north bay is occupied by an oriel. Windows have projecting lintels and 1/1 sash. The house sits on a cut granite foundation and is now sheathed with asbestos siding. Other Second Empire buildings are located at 626 County Street (#65-285 Photo #21) one story with mansard, 93 State Street (#65-127) and 1049 Pleasant Street (#65-127).

A house at 688 County Street (#65-321 Photo #1) provides an excellent example of the Colonial Revival style. It is square in plan, two stories in height and has a hipped roof. The symmetrical five bay facade has a central entrance flanked by side lights. Above this is an elaborately detailed Palladian window. The central elements are flanked by two story bows which contain two windows on each floor. The windows have simple architraves, 1/1 sash and shutters. The entire composition is framed by paneled corner pilasters which support a full entablature with a wide, dentiled frieze and a modillion cornice. A one story porch with a balustrade extends across the facade. Three dormers containing round arched windows light the attic; the central one has a broken scroll pediment while the flanking ones have triangular pediments. Another elaborate Colonial Revival house is located at 689 County Street (#65-59 Photo #27).

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The North Bedford Historic District retains integrity of design, setting, materials, workmanship and feeling and is significant as the major unaltered representation of a middle class nineteenth century residential development in New Bedford. The area is unique in its concentration of modest workers' housing interspersed with more elaborate homes. This interesting juxtaposition of styles and periods was caused by infill as the area grew during the nineteenth century in response to the enormous economic growth of the city caused first by whaling and later by the textile industry. Throughout this period, North Bedford remained the home of persons associated with support industries such as caulking, ropemaking, blacksmithing and house building and developed a character as distinctive as that of the County Street Historic District (National Register) where the whaling captains and mill owners tended to congregate.

Bedford Village (south of the present district) which was originally part of the neighboring town of Dartmouth, was first settled in 1640. Prior to 1760 it consisted of a few scattered farms owned by Quakers who had moved there from Rhode Island and Cape Cod. Its major period of development began in 1765 when Joseph Russell, one of the Quaker farmers, sold ten acres near the waterfront to Joseph Rotch to be divided into house and commercial lots. Russell, who named the town after the Duke of Bedford, turned to whaling and within a few years shipbuilders had been attracted to the area.

After the Revolution, during which the early settlement was largely destroyed, New Bedford continued to develop as a whaling port. By 1820 it had surpassed Nantucket in the amount of whaling revenues gathered and continued to lead the field until the 1850's. Records indicate that the first movement of residents to North Bedford occurred during the first half of the nineteenth century in direct response to the growth of whaling and its requirements for laborers and tradesmen. Grocers, druggists and housewrights, as well as many of the skilled craftsmen, employed in all phases of the whaling industry built modest homes on the small lots of this district which were laid out from the farms which had occupied the area previously. Some of the houses associated with these everyday workers include the George Cannon House at 34 Willis Street (#65-132 Photo #6 Greek Revival; C. 1856; Caulker), the Daniel Pease House at 584 County Street (#58-160 Photo #14; Federal; C. 1831; blacksmith) and the Obadiah Burgess House at 65 Walden Street (#58-175 Photo #17; Federal; C. 1835; housewright).

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The whaling captains and merchants continued to live primarily in the County Street Historic District (National Register) to the south although some did construct their mansions along the hilltop on County Street and in other scattered locations in the area. One prominent whaling family moved to this area in the 1830's was that of Edward Robinson. His daughter, Hetty Robinson Green, became internationally famous as the richest woman in the world in the later nineteenth century. She often visited the Italianate house at 899 Pleasant Street (#58-302 Photo #23) while living in rented quarters at the Greek Revival house at 1061 Pleasant Street (#65-133).

The discovery of oil in Pennsylvania in 1857 led to the demise of the New England whaling industry but New Bedford did not experience an economic recession. Rather, it became a major textile producing center. The first textile plant, the Wamsutta Mills, was chartered in 1846 but grew slowly. It was not until the whaling industry failed that textile production established itself as the economic backbone of New Bedford. North Bedford continued the same development pattern that had been established earlier in the century and remained in general a neighborhood of moderate income families associated with support industries. Houses representative of the later nineteenth century include the Paul Howland House at 91 State Street (#65-129; Photo #5; Second Empire; 1877; builder), the Hadley-Oesting House at 689 County Street (#65-59; Photo #27; Colonial Revival; 1895; businessman), and the Isacc Tompkins House at 691 County Street (#65-56; Photo #26; Queen Anne; 1889; grocer).

During this century, New Bedford has experienced severe economic decline as its textile mills closed and moved south, attracted by cheap labor and materials. This along with the density of nineteenth century construction explains the extremely small number of intrusions within the North Bedford Historic District. Widespread demolition which resulted from the urban renewal programs of the 1960's destroyed much of the surrounding area, but North Bedford continues to be a major low-moderate income residential neighborhood representing nineteenth century developments.

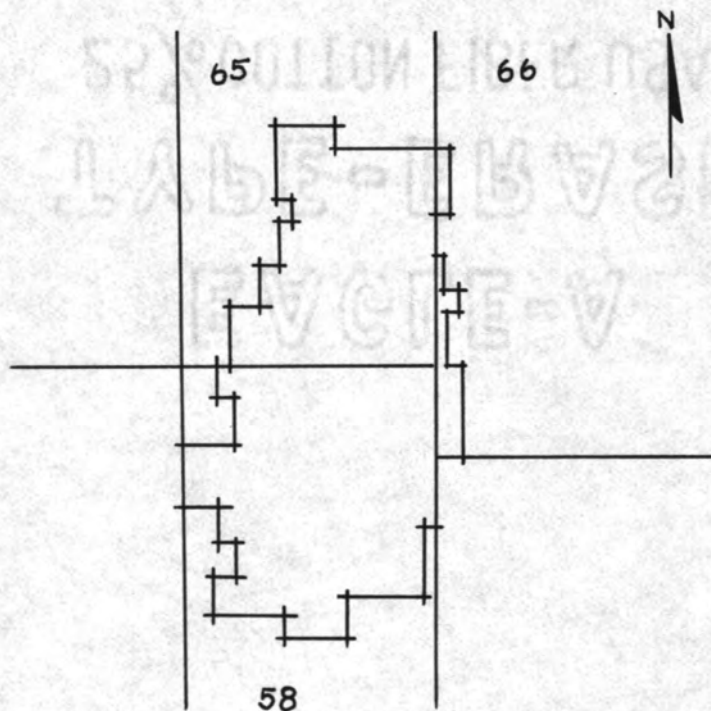
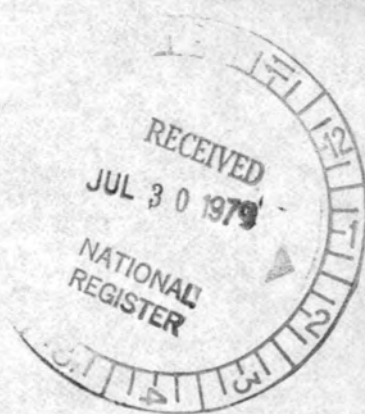

PLAT ARRANGEMENT

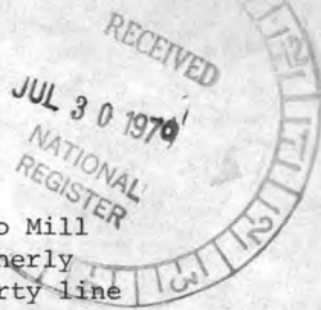

This area is rich in history. Bartholomew Gosnold in 1602 discovered the Acushnet River and the adjoining shores upon which New Bedford stands. The original intention of Gosnold and his men was for some to remain, but they changed their minds and returned to England.

About thirty to forty years later, the country began to be settled by the English, and in 1654, The Indian chief Massasoit of the Wampanoag tribe and his son Wamsutta deeded to William Bradford, Captain Miles Standish, John Cooke and others the territory then known as Dartmouth.

Several years later, in 1660, it was ordered that the territory be given to the original purchasers of Dartmouth in consideration for their paying any charges to the Indians. Among these men was Mannases Kempton whose tract was the original location of what is presently called North Bedford. As a matter of fact, the street immediately south of Mill Street, the location of my home, is named Kempton Street. It would seem to me to be very appropriate to have this district listed in the Nation Register.

The Waterfront Historic Area League is a non-profit preservation organization which was founded in 1962 to preserve the "historic sites, buildings, wharves, and other structures of New Bedford and contiguous towns". Toward this end WHALE operates a revolving fund to acquire threatened properties and make necessary improvements with the goal of selling them to owners who will preserve their historic integrity and put them to profitable use.

Until three years ago WHALE's preservation/restoration effort was centered on the waterfront historic district, a thirteen block area in downtown New Bedford which was designated a national landmark in 1966. Since then, WHALE has expanded its projects to include the rehabilitation of nine residential properties in three nearby neighborhoods.

Seven of these properties: 94 Maxfield Street, 923, 931, 937, 939, 953 Pleasant Street and 59 Hillman are located in the prospective North Bedford Historic District. The structures range in architectural style from the Federal to Greek Revival and Gothic periods, ca. 1820 - 1890. As such, they are characteristic of the majority of the buildings in the North Bedford area.

In 1977 WHALE's Board of Directors viewed the purchase of these properties and their subsequent exterior restoration as a step that would begin to encourage neighborhood revitalization as well as

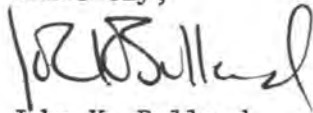

first recorded as sold to Hayden Coggeshall on April 16, 1850. On May 8, 1867 the property and building was owned by John Wilcox and was sold to Lloyd Howland as shown in Book 60 page 84.

An old atlas at the Registry of Deeds of Bristol County, dated 1881, shows the house and property on the street diagram of this area.

The property passed to Henry Hathaway and also later to James Pease, etc. and in 1938 we purchased the property of 662 County St from George Cherry who obtained it from the Jean family.

Houses constructed in the days when artisans took pride in their work, and did not build in early deterioration, should have their work preserved as standing tangible history for future generations to see. Therefore, not having to rely only on the word descriptions of historians.
