### NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The High Point Terrace Historic District is located in the city of Memphis, Shelby County, in western Tennessee. The district encompasses roughly 1.5 square miles and is bounded by Highland Avenue on the west, Eastland and Swan Ridge Circle on the east, Walnut Grove on the south, and Sam Cooper Boulevard on the north. The north end of the district features the High Point Terrace Shopping Center that remains as an intact example of a post-World War II neighborhood shopping center. The L and N Railroad runs northeast and divides the district in half.

The district is an excellent example of a mid-twentieth century middle class suburban neighborhood consisting of houses mainly built during the years 1940 to 1952. Containing a total of 1363 structures, of which 1180 are contributing, High Point Terrace retains a largely intact representation of popular early to mid-twentieth century architectural styles. In the early part of the twentieth century the Craftsman style bungalow form predominates in the district while, in the post-War years, the overwhelming choices were the Minimal Traditional and Colonial Revival styles on either cape cottage or double-pile cottage forms. High Point Terrace also retains some of the city's best examples of post-World War II Modernist style influenced houses found on forms such as the transitional Minimal Traditional/Ranch to the ever-popular traditional ranch house. The building stock consists primarily of houses; duplexes at major intersecting streets, and detached garages.

The majority of detached garages and early carports found throughout the district remain from the neighborhood's intense development during the 1940s. These outbuildings are located at the rear of most lots and are most often one-story, one-bay, clad with weatherboard, and feature a gable-front roof. Due to continued maintenance through the decades, the vast majority of all historic resources are in good to excellent condition.

The arrangement and lot orientation of the district's streets are indicative to a period of subdivision development known as the "automobile suburb" pattern. The majority of the houses within the district are single-family, feature one-and-a-half stories, and are clad in brick veneer with weatherboard gables. The pattern of development in the district has evolved from a slight grid pattern indicative of the urban grid design used by city planners before World War II to irregular, gently curving streets representative of post-war suburban development. East-west streets, along with the north-south streets of Sevier and Eastland measure 50-60 feet across. These feed into the wide north-south arteries of Highland Avenue and High Point Terrace.

Planned and developed in two primary phases, the 1920s to the 1930s and 1940 to 1952, High Point Terrace represents the architectural development of residential design from its earlier use of bungalow plans and Craftsman and Tudor Revival influence cottages to the dominant Minimal Traditional, Colonial Revival, and Modernist styling following the depression and World War II. High Point Terrace's distinct character is derived from its nearly homogeneous Minimal Traditional, Colonial Revival, and Modernist styling, large-scaled lots, uniform setbacks, and streets lined with mature hardwood trees. The Minimal Traditional style found in the district represents a compromise of earlier styles such as Colonial or Tudor Revival with the reality of the need for economical house construction following the depression of the 1930s. Minimal Traditional styling simplified earlier decorative features until houses merely featured prominent front-facing gables, chimneys, and occasional Colonial Revival influence at the entrance. For example, the distinctive porch feature found on many Memphis bungalows was largely abandoned and replaced by a partial porch cut from the corner of a gable, a small covered bay, or a simple stoop.

While 1940s double-pile and cape cottages remain as the dominant house form in the district, post-World War II Modernist-influenced forms including the minimal ranch, massed ranch, and traditional ranch are found throughout the neighborhood. Of the 1362 residential structures within the district, 46% are one of the three ranch house types. Consistent examples are found in larger numbers along Aurora Circle, Cardinal Avenue, Eastland Avenue, Charleswood Avenue, Highland Park Place, and Montclair Drive.

Although dominated by the Minimal Traditional, Colonial Revival, and Modernist styles, the district does contain a variety of distinctive architectural styles. The Craftsman bungalows that appear in the northernmost section of the district represent the neighborhood's early development and remain as the only examples as similar structures located to the north of the district were removed during the construction of Sam Cooper Boulevard in the 1970s. Similar examples of Craftsman bungalows dating from the early to mid-1920s can be found at 3523, 3530, and 3569 Autumn Avenue and at 3565, 3579, and 3623 Galloway Avenue. Within the same section of the district, a 1912 two-story weatherboard Foursquare with Queen Anne and Colonial Revival influence remains at 3515 Autumn Avenue. It is distinctive as it features Queen Anne multi-light diamond pattern upper window sashes. A rare Memphis example of a 1946 Lustron pre-fabricated ranch house with Modernist influence featuring aluminum-panel wall surfaces is located at 3608 Charleswood Avenue.

# PRINCIPAL ARCHITECTURAL STYLE & FORM INFLUENCES IN HIGH POINT TERRACE HISTORIC DISTRICT

#### **Bungalow form**

The bungalow is a generic term applied to relatively unpretentious one-story or one-and-a-half-story houses characterized by a small size, overall simplicity, broad gables, porches with square large square or battered piers, and exposed structural members. It emerged shortly after the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century and became a dominant house type throughout America in the 1920s. The American bungalow originated in California and spread nationwide largely through the work of architects Charles and Henry Greene and the popularity of pattern books and architectural magazines. It also has roots in the Arts and Crafts movement. Although it is most often associated with the Craftsman style, bungalows in the High Point Historic District often feature other stylistic details such as Colonial Revival.

#### Cape Cottage form

This house form is derived from a vernacular type developed in early Colonial New England. It gained renewed national popularity in the late 1920s with the rise in popularity of the Colonial Revival style and with the advent of the Great Depression of the 1930s, its initial small size and low cost made it synonymous with the suburban landscape. It is generally one-and-a-half stories with a side-gabled roof and central front entrance, often pedimented. Single window units are symmetrically arranged and usually feature six-over-six double-hung sashes. The upper half-story often featured gable-front dormers.

#### Double-pile Cottage form

This widely popular house type emerged in Memphis in 1910, but was not common until the 1930s. It flourished in the post-World War II housing boom years as it was associated with the "G.I. Bill." Generally, the Double-pile Cottage plan is two-rooms wide and two-rooms deep under a single gable roof. A common variation is a gable-L that features an additional room or an extended room located in a front-facing, projecting gable-front wing. As simplified building forms, this type almost always exhibited the minimal detailing of the Minimal Traditional architectural style and is found throughout older East Memphis.

#### Minimal Ranch form

This type reflects the early growing popularity of the ranch design as it is a scaled-down version of the Traditional Ranch built as an inexpensive choice. Most often found in suburban housing projects, clustered together on curved streets with small lots it blends features of both Minimal Traditional and Modernist styles. Its characteristics include side-gabled roofs and a strict linear plan and footprint. Integral garages are often small, thus allowing only a single car. Like other ranch forms and the Minimal Traditional style, the Minimal Ranch often featured a prominent picture window.

#### Massed Ranch form

A common subtype of the ranch house without the defining element of a linear plan, this house type does exhibit many of the same features. Its distinction is derived from its differing footprint width and depth. It generally does not present as wide a frontage to the street as does the Traditional Ranch. Instead, it extends much deeper. Garages are typically attached, but not integral as found on Traditional Ranch examples. Massed Ranch houses were generally built on smaller and older lots.

#### Traditional Ranch form

This form traces it development from the mid-1930s, but saw its popularity rise in the early 1950s. The "rambling" ranch features a horizontal orientation, an asymmetrical facade, and a dominant low-pitch roof. It is loosely based on early Spanish Colonial precedents of the American southwest, modified by influences borrowed from Craftsman and Prairie modernism of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. The footprint of the house usually features an "L" or "U," but sometimes cross or linear plans are found. Native stone, brick, or combinations of the two are most typically used wall cladding. The use of casement windows, often seen in bands, complements the sense of horizontality.

#### Lustron House

This house, located at 3608 Charleswood in High Point Terrace, represents an architectural response to the need for housing following World War II. As a mass produced, pre-fabricated building, its defining characteristics consist of

one-story heights and an exterior of square enamel-coated steel tiles available in a limited number of pastel colors. Several different designs were offered with some featuring matching garages. All hardware and appliances were shipped with the pre-fabricated house. Over 2,500 units were sold nationwide and all featured an all-metal interior warmed by a unique radiant heating system built into a space above the ceiling.

### Craftsman style

The Craftsman style was a break from 19<sup>th</sup> century derivative architecture that dominated American home construction until ca. 1910. The identifying characteristics of the Craftsman style include low-pitched gable roofs with wide, unenclosed eave overhangs. The houses often had exposed roof rafters, decorative beams or braces commonly added under the gables, either full or partial-width porches, the roof supported by tapered square columns and columns that frequently extend to the ground. Locally, the Craftsman style retained its popularity until the mid-1930s. Many bungalow forms feature Craftsman detailing.

Craftsman windows feature double-hung sashes usually with three vertical panes over a single-light sash. Craftsman doors are known to feature multiple lights composed of a band of lights with the tracery arranged in a set of bordering square and rectangular panes.

#### Colonial Revival style

This was the dominant style of domestic architecture throughout America during the first half of the twentieth century. Identifying features include an accentuated front door, usually with an engaged pediment supported by pilasters; a symmetrical façade and windows with double-hung sashes, usually with multi-pane glazing.

#### Minimal Traditional style

Dominating architecture from ca. 1935-1950, this overwhelmingly popular style is found throughout the entire district. Its common cape cottage and various double-pile cottage forms are similar to that of the English Cottage and simplified detail stemming from previous Tudor Revival and Colonial Revival precedents, but with a lower roof pitch, at least one front-facing gable, one to one-and-a-half stories in height. Porches are often small and may be either sheltered by the main roof or have a separate roof. Like the Minimal Ranch, it often features a prominent picture window.

#### Modernist style

An architectural style that represents the abandonment of historical stylistic precedents in favor of new variations of modern styles begun in Europe before World War I. Minimal Traditional style is viewed as the earliest of the Modernist styles following the Great Depression and becomes outnumbered by more restrained detailing found in the

minimal, massed, and traditional ranch house forms. By the early 1950s, Modernist style houses, mostly found in ranch house forms, typify the evolution from cape cottage and double-pile cottage forms that exhibit Minimal Traditional or Colonial Revival stylistic influence. This phase of Modernism is often termed "Post-Depression Modern" and is characterized by the use of new materials and technologies. It is set apart from its architect-influenced, truly Modern cousin by its use of applied ornament. Typical stylistic elements include low pitch hipped or flat roofs with little or no eave, masonry walls with a horizontal emphasis, and corner casement windows that are usually steel casements. Throughout the High Point Terrace Historic District houses exhibit these Modernist elements, but also older stylistic elements such as entries with broken pediments and other Colonial Revival holdovers.

By the 1960s, the European Modernist style's lack of decorative detailing and sense of horizontality emerges into the American Prairie split-level house form first popularized by Frank Lloyd Wright and the Chicago School in the early years of the twentieth century.

#### Tudor Revival style

A side-gabled, steeply pitched roof usually identifies this style that was popular from the turn of the century to about 1940. The facade is often dominated by one or more prominent cross gables; decorative half-timbering; tall narrow windows, usually in multiple groups with multi-pane glazing; and dominant chimneys. Rounded entryways or windows are also common. Tudor Revival houses are often clad in brick, stone, stucco, or a combination of these materials.

#### **INVENTORY**

An inventory of all resources in the High Point Terrace Historic District was prepared by David Royer, Rachel Engstrom, Candice Carr, and John Weeden from October 2000 to May 2001, as part of the *Memphis Cultural Resources Survey* by Memphis Heritage, Inc. The neighborhood history and development, contained in the "Statement of Significance," is drawn from David Royer's "High Point Terrace Coverform."

Note on Contributing/Noncontributing Buildings: Buildings in High Point Terrace Historic District are listed as contributing (C) if they were built within the period of significance, retain integrity, and add to the historic sense of time and place of the district. Noncontributing buildings (NC) were built within the last fifty years or are historic buildings that have been altered to a degree that has destroyed their historic integrity.

### **AURORA CIRCLE**

1. <u>283 Aurora Circle</u> <u>C</u>. One-story, five-bay, brick veneer cape cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Side gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes. Entrance is a single bay stoop with shed roof awning and Colonial Revival cottage door.

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Garage, ca. 1947. One-story, one-bay, asbestos-siding veneer, gable-front roof. (C).

2. <u>284 Aurora Circle</u> <u>C</u>. One-story, four-bay, brick veneer double-pile cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes. Single-bay shed roof porch supported by wrought iron. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door.

3. <u>289 Aurora Circle</u> <u>C</u>. One-story, three-bay, brick veneer cape cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Side gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are paired 6/6 double-hung sashes. Single-bay shed roof porch supported by wrought iron. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door.

4. <u>290 Aurora Circle</u> <u>C</u>. One-story, three-bay, brick veneer double-pile cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Gable roofs with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 8/8 double-hung sashes. Single-bay gable roof porch supported by wrought iron. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door.

Garage, ca. 1955. One-story, two-bay, brick veneer, gable-front roof. (NC).

5. <u>293 Aurora Circle</u> <u>C</u>. One-story, four-bay, brick veneer double-pile cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Side gable roof with box cornice, diamond-patterned brick course in gable, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes and single-light stationary. Single-bay shed-roof porch supported by partially-enclosed frame infill. Entrance has Colonial Revival door.

Carport, ca. 1947. One-story, one-bay, weatherboard, gable-front roof. (C).

6. <u>294 Aurora Circle C</u>. One-story, five-bay, brick veneer cape cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Cross-gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes. Single-bay stoop with shed roof awning. Entrance has Colonial Revival door with surround, arched pediment with incised floral motif.

7. <u>299 Aurora Circle</u> C. 1 ½ story, three-bay, brick veneer gable-front "L" cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes and single-light stationary flanked by 4/4 sashes. Single-bay shed roof porch supported by boxed column. Entrance has a two-light Colonial Revival door.

Garage, ca. 1980. One-story, one-bay, vinyl-siding veneer, gable-front roof. (NC).

8. <u>300 Aurora Circle C</u>. One-story, four-bay, brick veneer massed ranch house with Minimal Traditional and Modernist influence, built 1947. Hip roof with box cornice, covered by asphalt shingles. Windows are 1/1 double-hung sashes in banks of three. Single-bay undercut hip roof porch supported by wrought iron. Entrance has Colonial Revival door.

Garage, ca. 1955. One-story, two-bay, vinyl-siding veneer, gable-front roof. (NC).

9. <u>306 Aurora Circle C</u>. One-story, three-bay, brick veneer double-pile cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Cross gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 8/12 and 6/6 double-hung sashes, some in pairs. Undercut, off-center porch within gable supported by wrought iron. Entrance has Colonial Revival door.

10. <u>312 Aurora Circle</u> C. One-story, five-bay, brick veneer cape cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes. Entrance has a full-length multi-light door.

11. <u>318 Aurora Circle</u> C. One-story, three-bay, brick-veneer massed ranch house with Minimal Traditional and Modernist influence, built 1947. Hip roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are paired 1/1 double-hung sashes. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door.

12. <u>324 Aurora Circle</u> C. One-story, three-bay, brick veneer double-pile cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1947. Cross-gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes and a single-light picture window. Single-bay hip roof porch supported by wrought iron. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door.

Garage, ca. 1955. One-story, two-bay, vinyl-siding veneer, hip roof. (NC).

1358. <u>3804 Woodland</u> C. One-story, six-bay, brick veneer traditional ranch house with Modernist influence, built 1949. Hip roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 8-light double-casements. Entrance has a six-panel door with 3-light sidelights.

Garage, ca. 1949. One-story, one-bay, weatherboard, hip roof. (C).

1359. <u>3811 Woodland</u> C. One-story, five-bay, weatherboard cape cottage with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1949. Gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 12/12, 8/8, and 6/6 double-hung sashes. Entrance is set within a recessed paneled reveal with round arch and pilaster surround and features a six-panel door with multi-light fanlight.

1360. <u>3814 Woodland C</u>. One-and-a-half-story, six-bay, stucco-veneer traditional ranch house with Tudor Revival influence, built 1910. Complex gable roof with shed roof dormer featuring 6-light hopper windows in a band of three, gable-end half-timbering, box cornice, and covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 6/6 double-hung sashes, in pairs and bands of three. Partial-width shed roof porch supported by paired box piers and brackets. Entrances feature multi-light double French doors.

1361. <u>3825 Woodland</u> C. One-story, five-bay, brick, weatherboard, and board and batten siding veneer traditional ranch house with Modernist influence, built 1950. Cross-gable roof with box cornice and return, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are 2/2 double-hung sashes and multi-light fixed and casements. Partial-width undercut porch supported by box piers. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door with multi-light sidelights.

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1362. <u>3826 Woodland C</u>. One-and-a-half-story, six-bay, brick veneer traditional ranch house with Minimal Traditional influence, built 1950. Cross-gable roof with gable-end five-light fanlight, box cornice, and covered with asphalt shingles. Single-bay undercut porch with wrought iron support. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door.

1363. <u>3835 Woodland</u> C. One-story, eight-bay brick veneer and vertical board siding traditional ranch house with Modernist influence, built 1950. Gable roof with box cornice, covered with asphalt shingles. Windows are multi-light casements. Entrance has a Colonial Revival door with multi-light sidelights. Attached single-bay gable-front garage.

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#### NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The High Point Terrace Historic District is being nominated under Criterion A in the area of community planning and development. The large residential district, with its centrally-located commercial area and a considerable number of extant historic garages, reflects the patterns of post-World War II suburbanization in Memphis. Under criterion C, the district is significant as a cohesive collection of twentieth century residential architecture featuring a variety of examples of the immensely popular Minimal Traditional and Colonial Revival styles as well as preceding styles such as Craftsman and early Modernist ranch forms that emerged in the late 1940s.

The properties meet the registration requirements of the Memphis residential MPS as amended to 1960.

High Point Terrace Historic District represents Memphis' most notable representation of the great demand for singlefamily housing in the post-World War II years. Returning veterans armed with the G.I. Bill of Rights and professionals using loans provided by the Federal Housing Authority found the "American Dream" of homeownership in the rapidly developing area of East Memphis. The housing stock reflects the period's emerging post-Depression Modernism as characterized by simplified ornamentation, cheaper building methods, and emphasis on the automobile. The High Point Terrace Historic District derives its significance also in that the post-Depression Modern style represents a transition from late 1930s and early post-World War II double-pile and cape cottage forms to the popular ranch house forms that dominated residential designs in Memphis by the 1950s. The neighborhood's limited number of floor plans and decorative elements were mixed and matched by speculative builders, which enabled variety yet led to an overall homogeneity represented by the Minimal Traditional, Colonial Revival, and Modernist architectural styles. The popularity of these emerging new architectural styles and house forms of the 1940s and early 1950s created a cohesive neighborhood defined by low pitched hip and gable roofs with little or no eaves, masonry walls with a horizontal emphasis, and corner windows most often being casements.

The High Point Terrace Historic District's architectural development by the late 1940s and early 1950s further exemplifies the post-Depression Modern style's experiments with using new materials and technology with the construction of one of Memphis' few enamel-coated steel tile exterior Lustron houses at 3608 Charleswood Avenue and its examples of full traditional ranch houses with their overwhelming horizontal massing at the eastern edge of the district along Eastland Street.

#### EARLY DEVELOPMENT

The development of High Point Terrace began in 1919 as a virtually undeveloped tract of dairy farms about a mile and a half east of the Memphis city limits. Highland Avenue on the west, Summer Avenue on the north, Walnut Grove on the south, and Graham Street on the east existed at this time and formed the borders of what would become a sprawling suburban development. Mostly consisting of small farms from 10 to 50 acres, the entire census tract only contained 20 homes in 1919 (see attached area map of 1940 to 1951 comparison). High Point Terrace, an eventual main north/south artery of the neighborhood, consisted of only an unimproved dirt road that ran south off of Summer Avenue about a block before it became a dead-end.

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In 1919, when the entire area was still outside the city limits of Memphis, development began with the formation of the Highland Boulevard subdivision. Within this early development, bungalows with Craftsman influence were built along Autumn, Galloway, and Forrest Avenues at the northwest section of the present-day district (just east of Highland Avenue) and to the north of this area. During this early phase of development, 185 homes were built, however, many are now lost due to the 1970s construction of Sam Cooper Boulevard (Interstate 40). The 1906 Koch House at 3515 Autumn Avenue remains as an earlier predecessor of the Highland Boulevard subdivision development as a Four-Square farmhouse with Queen Anne and Colonial Revival influence.<sup>1</sup> By 1929, the earliest development of High Point Terrace was annexed by the City of Memphis.

#### PRE AND POST-WAR DEVELOPMENT

The ongoing Depression throughout the 1930s greatly diminished the level of suburban development in Memphis. During the 1930s, the vast majority of area comprising the present day High Point Terrace Historic consisted of fields and forests, multi-acre estates, and truck farms remaining from the earliest period of development (see attached area map of 1940 to 1951 comparison). The building boom responsible for Memphis' architectural development in the forty years before World War II resumed in the post-war period due to a severe housing shortage, the opportunity to acquire home mortgages through the Federal Housing Authority and the G.I. Bill of Rights, and the abundance of cheap land on the fringe of the central city. The end of World War II brought 30,000 veterans back to Memphis, which enabled vast subdivision developments to commence as well as enable pre-war neighborhoods to near completion.

The High Point Terrace Historic District received its greatest development in the period 1940 to 1952. During this period, 90% of the houses were built which led to land-owning farmers who bought their land for \$50 an acre at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century receiving \$2,500 or more per acre from developers. Within this period of significance, the population of the area increased almost 700%, from 938 residents to 6,056. The rapid growth of High Point Terrace in this period places it within an historic context of booming post-war suburban development across the country as vast and cheap land, burgeoning new construction, as well as an increased use of the automobile made the suburban lifestyle more accessible. The "American Dream" with its requisite suburban home and automobile made it possible to commute to urban employment while at the same time provide a tranquil lifestyle for raising children in a single-family home environment.<sup>2</sup>

The rapid suburban development of High Point Terrace traces itself to the development company of Chandler and Chandler with its 1940 opening of the Greenlawn subdivision. Chandler and Chandler, founded in 1906 by William C. Chandler who popularized the bungalow in 1920s Memphis, is known for its successful developments such as Speedway Terrace Historic District (NR 3/19/1999), Shadowlawn Historic District (NR 8/14/1995), and the Prescott Circle Subdivision, where Chandler collaborated with architect J. Frazer Smith in 1939 to produce 34 affordable houses. Prescott Circle, like developments within High Point Terrace, features Minimal Traditional and Colonial Revival stylistic influences featuring variations on a basic double-pile cottage with side-gable plans, gable-front extensions, add-on or incised porches, and many with attached garages.<sup>3</sup>

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William C. Chandler's son and business partner, Charles K. Chandler, emerged as the primary developer of High Point Terrace with his development of the original Greenlawn subdivision. Built 1940-41 on 10 acres of the Koch dairy farm, 25 acres of the Miller estate, and 25 acres of Blatt's farm, Greenlawn consisted of Philwood, Shirlwood, and Kenwood Avenues from Highland Avenue on the west to Sevier on the east (see attached area map of 1940 to 1951 comparison). With the advent of World War II, further development stalled until a 1945 addition created Charleswood and Johnwood Avenues (then known as Johnson Avenue). By 1946, the last addition to Greenlawn opened up Shirlwood, Kenwood, Charleswood, and Johnwood from Sevier on the west to High Point Terrace on the east. In addition, Swan Ridge Circle was developed east of High Point Terrace.

Some of the architectural and planning significance related to the early development of High Point Terrace is tied to the designer of the original Greenlawn subdivision, architect J. Frazer Smith. A prolific designer of Colonial Revival and Modernism in Memphis in the first half of the twentieth-century, Smith made a name for himself as the Memphis regional director of the Historic American Building Survey beginning in 1935. His work with HABS included documentation and supervision of the demolition of some of the city's oldest building stock including dilapidated slum housing north of downtown in order to make way for his design for the city's first public housing project named Lauderdale Courts. The 1936 Lauderdale Courts (NR 7/25/1996) and his design for Dixie Homes, Foote Homes and Lamar Terrace housing projects in 1938 were among the first in the nation funded by the Public Works Administration. Their campus-like setting featuring low residential-scale buildings similar to single-family neighborhoods became a national standard.<sup>4</sup>

Smith's contribution to Memphis' architectural development during the Depression is evident in his formation of the Memphis Small House Construction Bureau consisting of mortgage lenders, building supply houses, home builders, and architects. Smith's initiative was in response to the Federal Housing Administration's desire to create a solution to the problem of providing new housing for the middle class. The Federal Housing Administration wanted assurance that mortgage insured houses were architect-designed and of quality construction. The Bureau allowed member architects to provide plans and specifications for varying house types ranging from 1,200 to 1,600 square feet with costs between \$2,500 to \$8,000 that were to be built by a member builder. The benefit of this program, from the buyer's perspective, was that a selection from almost one hundred stock plans depending on budget constraints would receive guaranteed mortgage insurance through the Federal Housing Administration. In addition, the architect's design was insured as he was retained to oversee construction.<sup>5</sup>

The Bureau proved to be a great success for Memphis as evidenced in 1938 that 1,200 houses had been insured in the previous year, and of these 85% were architect-designed homes as opposed to 15% in the year before. As the Memphis Small House Construction Bureau program continued in the 1940s, examples of this housing development initiative were built within the High Point Terrace Historic District on the following avenues named for developer Charles K. Chandler's children: Charleswood, Johnwood, Kenwood, and Shirlwood. Similar East Memphis examples also remain along Reese Street in the East Buntyn National Register District (NR 10/4/1995), Hollywood Street and Alicia Drive in the Poplar Glen/Green Meadows neighborhood, and throughout the southern half of The Village neighborhood off of Poplar Avenue; both areas are potentially National Register-eligible post-World War II districts.<sup>6</sup>

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J. Frazer Smith's subdivision design in the late 1930s in neighborhoods such as The Village and Rosemary Lane Subdivision, part of the Central Gardens National Historic District (NR 9/9/1982), are significant antecedents of future development throughout older East Memphis and High Point Terrace in particular. Beginning in 1938, Rosemary Lane Subdivision, with its thirty-three small, but architecturally distinctive designs in the Colonial Revival and Minimal Traditional styles built along curving landscaped streets demonstrated that a quality residential environment could be manifested for low-to-middle-income homeowners. Smith's work on The Village, however, produced more expensive homes on larger lots in a more detailed Colonial Revival style based on a Colonial village with strong influence by the namesake of its principal street, Williamsburg Lane. Both developments, with their characteristic one-story brick cottages with Colonial Revival details became the template for residential architecture in post-World War II East Memphis.<sup>7</sup> The small Minimal Traditional designs of Rosemary Lane consisting of threebays, often offset entries, and a general lack of any porch is mimicked in the middle to upper section of High Point Terrace. Examples at 3540 and 3546 Johnwood Drive, both built in 1946, exemplify the need of affordable house design found throughout Rosemary Lane and are almost mirror images of each other with their boxy massing and general lack of detail. In addition, the growing need of housing the family's automobile is seen at 3540 Johnwood Avenue with its recessed single-bay attached garage similar to those found throughout J. Frazer Smith's 1940s Prescott Circle.

In the post-war years, High Point Terrace became more of a coherent neighborhood with continual subdivisions and street development as well as benefiting from a nearly uniform architectural style promoted and popularized by architect J. Frazer Smith. The district's long east-west avenues are complemented with curvilinear streets found along Swan Ridge Circle, Montclair, and Rosemary Drives in the northeast portion of the neighborhood. The influence behind these developments stems from pre-war suburban development nationwide due to the New Deal planning recommendations of the National Resources Planning Board. Established in 1935, the board published more than 370 pamphlets up until the early 1940s that espoused maximime land use planning, the reduction of building costs, and overall subdivision planning. Geared toward county and city planning officials, developers were also educated on the possibility of building more houses on smaller plots of land that required less infrastructure and cost for development. This curvilinear street development concept was first found in Memphis' Vollintine-Evergreen Avalon Historic District (NR 5/23/1997) that has a 1925-1947 period of significance.<sup>8</sup>

The architectural development that escalated throughout the High Point Terrace Historic District in the post-war period created long avenues and curvilinear streets that were overwhelmingly influenced by the Minimal Traditional style. As a simplified version of the Colonial Revival style, Minimal Traditional styling was chosen for hundreds of cape and double-pile cottage variations with characteristic low-pitch roofs, little decorative detail, often front-facing gables, and very common 6/6 double-hung sash windows. As the majority of the district represents post-war development, the architectural styling found throughout is a symbol of the times. The late 1940s represent a building boom of historic proportions still heavily influenced by the leaner times of the Great Depression. This post-depression age demanded that houses were built along cost-effective measures in terms of house plans and architectural design. This development philosophy is most evident in the northern-half of the district, primarily north of the railroad tracks. While this area exemplifies the simiplified Minimal Traditional styling, smaller house plans

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found on countless typical cape cottages on Johnwood Avenue for example, and a higher number of duplexes such as those found on Barwood Drive, the southern half of the district features larger lot sizes, sprawling Minimal Traditional influenced minimal ranch houses and larger Modernist influenced traditional ranch house examples on primary thoroughfares such as Northwood Drive and Eastland Street.

By 1948-49, the district's growth was evidient as developer John B. Goodwin extended Philwood and Autumn Avenues from Sevier to High Point Terrace (see attached High Point Terrace Subdivision Development map). The north/south artery of High Point Terrace itself was originally identified as Dilworth Street, which ran north from Walnut Grove. Dilworth, however, was renamed to be consistent with the existing High Point Terrace that ran south from Summer Avenue. Following numerous extensions to both existing streets throughout the 1940s, the two became joined finally at the intersection of Swan Ridge Circle North. Despite the progress of continual street development, most of the streets remained as unimproved dirt roads until the early 1950s with the exception of the concrete paved Highland, Walnut Grove, and Summer Avenues.<sup>9</sup>

Following the initial establishment of the Greenlawn subdivision, Chandler and Chandler developed three additional subdivisions including: East Aurora on Mimosa and Aurora Circle, Twin Willows east of High Point Terrace, and Dunrovin located on the southern half of Sevier Street east to High Point Terrace (see attached area map of 1940 to 1951 comparison). This development was enhanced by Marx and Bensdorf, Inc.'s re-subdivision of the old Highland Avenue Park subdivision, which built-out much of Waynoka, Oakley, and Highland Park Avenues as well as Northwood Drive. Wilkinson Place, a small dead-end street extending north from Mimosa Avenue, was also developed in the early 1950s along with Dobson-Smith's development of Southwood Avenue, Normandy Circle, and properties on the north side of Walnut Grove across from Galloway Golf Course.<sup>10</sup>

This tremendous growth throughout the 1940s and early 1950s led to the almost complete build-out of the High Point Terrace District. The construction of the district's only Lustron House in 1946, which remains as one of only a few in Memphis, adds to the significance of the High Point Terrace Historic District as a symbol of the American dream of suburbanization and as a tribute to Modernism's faith in factories and mechanization as it was literally built like a Ford automobile. The house at 3608 Charleswood Avenue represents businessman Carl Strandlund's idea to develop a pre-fabricated house constructed entirely of enameled steel panels to meet the pent-up post-World War II housing demand. Strandlund, who had previous experience making prefabricated commerical buildings such as Standard Oil gas stations and White Castle restuarants, manufactured Lustron Homes in his million square foot factory in Columbus, Ohio. As a one-story, Modernist ranch form with a high degree of integrity the High Point Terrace example remains as one of 2,500 units constructed and sold nationwide during the company's short history that ended in 1950. Like all other numbered Memphis examples, it is a two-bedroom, one-bath, 1200 square foot deluxe model.<sup>11</sup>

By 1952, the district's architectural development evolved into a modest acceptance of Modernist influenced styling that would foreshadow the style's immense popularity in East Memphis throughout the 1950s and 1960s. The acceptance of Modernism, albeit slowly, initially came in the form of ranch house forms with stylistic detailing from an earlier period. At 154 & 228 Eastland, traditional ranch houses built in 1951 & 1950 respectively with Colonial

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Revival influence at their entrances remain. However, by 1952 a truly Modernist influenced traditional ranch house complete with steel casement windows devoid of classical detailing was built at 108 Eastland. This culmination of architectural styling, from cape and double-pile cottage Minimal Traditional examples to ranch house Modernism, represents the district's 1940-1952 period of significance.

The rising property values and attractiveness of this area of post-war East Memphis was evident in the President of the Memphis Homebuilder's Association estimate that 12,000 new houses had been built in the surrounding blocks of Poplar and Highland Avenues, which was located one block south of the High Point Terrace District. Although High Point Terrace was not as upscale as J. Frazer Smith's designs in The Village, it represented a nearly homogenous upper-middle-class development. Near the peak of its development, median income levels for the neighborhood in 1949 was over \$5,300, which was roughly \$2,000 higher than the Memphis average of the same year. With median real estate values of \$13,500, it was an obtainable lifestyle for average professionals or trade workers, but out of reach for service and labor workers.<sup>12</sup> Like most 1940s and 1950s suburban development, High Point Terrace remained segregated by race as well as income. "Redlining" by financial institutions, in which discriminatory practices toward lending prevailed, shaped the make-up of the American suburb. Several original plat maps for the neighborhood featured restrictive covenants that barred African-Americans from homeownership. Along with "redlining," racial and economic discrimination was fostered by the Federal Housing Administration's policy of urging developers to market new housing to homogenous groups. According to the 1950 census, High Point Terrace exemplifies this historic context as only forty-three of the total 6,056 neighborhood residents were classified as non-white due.<sup>13</sup>

The homogenous racial and financial make-up of High Point Terrace by 1948 stands as a barometer of general East Memphis suburban development as well as that of post-war America. As residential development occurred on the edge of urban areas, service and retail development followed the masses. With the ever-increasing opportunity of automobile-ownership, this new lifestyle became more accessible. Central business districts, with department stores and specialty shops, increasing found themselves outdated. The abandonment of downtown was exacerbated by the establishment of suburban retail anchors that catered to the burgeoning population.

Chandler and Chandler's establishment of the High Point Terrace Shopping Center in 1947 demonstrates the ideology that suburban residents represented a growing market of consumers. The neighborhood center located at High Point Terrace and Shirlwood Avenue, was suburban Memphis' first and consisted of a grocery, drug store, bakery, shoe shop, beauty shop, gift shop, short-order restaurant, barbershop, dress shop, laundry, and hardware store. With job opportunities in downtown Memphis and a separate reclusive suburban residential lifestyle in East Memphis, residents of High Point Terrace now could become more self-sufficient with their own neighborhood shopping center.

The development of the High Point Terrace Shopping Center occurred only one year before the venerable downtown Lowenstein's Department store opened its first suburban location at the nearby intersection of Poplar and Highland Avenues. Lowenstein's, like Memphis' Goldsmith's Department Store among others, represented the change from an emphasis on central-city retail to an endless period of suburban growth and dominance.

Fifty years following its peak development, the High Point Terrace Historic District remains as Memphis' premier post-World War II suburban development. It retains a high degree of integrity in terms of its layout representing community planning and design as well as its well-maintained housing stock consisting of nearly-homogenous Colonial Revival, Minimal Traditional, and Modernist styles.

#### **VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION**

The boundaries of the district are Highland Avenue on the west, Eastland Street and Swan Ridge Circle on the east, Sam Cooper Boulevard on the north, and Walnut Grove on the south. A section at the southwest corner at Highland Avenue and Walnut Grove is excluded from the boundaries as single and multi-family planned urban development infill of modern construction has occurred.

#### **BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION**

The boundaries of the High Point Terrace Historic District include only those properties historically related to the development of the district. It is the most intact collection of historic resources that shows the architectural development of the district and is surrounded by modern developments and the interstate.






