

#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance


Once relatively common, school buildings of the size and form of South Ward School are increasingly falling prey to diminished school enrollment, fire code problems, and shifting demographic patterns. South Ward School is a good example of late Victorian school design with its display of Romanesque influences common to institutional and public facilities.

Locally quarried stone outlines the rectangular windows as well as unifying the composition through string courses on the first and second levels. A foundation of rough hewn stone sturdily anchors the structure to the ground. Especially pleasing are the brick arcades united by a projecting brick string course. Sets of five windows on the sides illuminate the classrooms on both stories. Modillions along the cornice offer an additional horizontal element along with the string courses. The effect is stalwart and solemn. The entrance pavilion features a wide Romanesque brick archway with stone keystone. Above it is a corbelled cornice to accent the entry.

Above the brick portion of the entrance pavilion is an enclosed clapboard bell tower with brackets or modillions similar to those along the cornice. Originally the school had a more elaborate bell tower of a flaired mansard shape and an open belfry above it. The original was thus higher and more imposing than this later change. The other modification is new steps and side walls, and the front door is probably not original.

South Ward School was built in 1896, according to contemporary newspaper accounts. It sits on an ample one-acre corner lot dotted with large oaks. Except for a park across the street, the area is residential. Most houses are wood frame and somewhat newer than the school, which therefore stands out quite handsomely in contrast.

# 8. Significance



#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The primary significance of the school appears to be architec tural. A survey of schools in the state may show that the school is among the best representatives of school building design for the period.

South Ward School was a grade school from 1697 to 1978 with a four-year hiatus due to low enrollment from 1949-1953.
