The Jesse H. Settlemier house at 355 N. Settlemier Avenue in Woodburn is a typical example of a medium to large frame house in the late Queen Anne style. Built in 1889, the central block of the two-story structure has a hip roof. Projecting wings to the north and east are gabled. The second story of the east wing overhangs a bay window. The northeast corner of the main block is rounded surmounting in a tower with a conical "candle-snuffer" roof, and has a concentric two-story porch with small balcony-like projections. The north side sports a porte-cochere off the dining room. Openings are square-headed except for two round-headed openings inside the northeast porch under the tower. The exterior is surfaced in horizontal tongue-in-groove siding with a slightly flared shingled skirt-like band at the base of the second story. A frieze-like band of vertical boarding flares out at the top of the walls into a molded cornice surrounding the house. Bracketing and trim of the catalogue-ornament variety are applied in a typical manner to porches and overhangs.

The interior of the house was remodelled in 1911 reflecting such Arts and Crafts movement influences as inglenooks, and much of the interior woodwork, finish, and fixtures date from that time. The house contains eleven rooms on two floors plus a basement and large attic. The ground floor flooring is oak. The dining room fir paneling and built-in China closet and buffet, as well as the porte-cochere off the dining room date from the 1911 remodelling, as do the bath rooms. The master bath contains a somewhat unusual foot bath. A wooden storage tank in the attic, still extant, provided water pressure for the plumbing, and an acetylene plant in the basement supplied the house with gas.

Since 1911, the only alteration to the house was the removal of a wall between two pantries in the 1950s, and the conversion of the resultant space into a kitchen. The living room wallpaper dates from 1911 or earlier. Thus, the house retains its 1911 appearance to an unusually high degree. A separate carriage house also stands on the grounds, which are landscaped with original Settlemier Nursery stock.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The French Prairie area is one of the oldest settled parts of Oregon. French Canadian trappers who had worked for John Jacob Astor and for the Hudson's Bay Company began relocating in the prairie areas near what is now Woodburn in 1829—hence the name French Prairie. Jesse Settlemier, a son of a pioneer nurseryman, purchased the original J. B. Duchane Donation Land Claim on the Boones Ferry Road, which was part of the main route from Portland to Sacramento, in 1863 and moved his father's business there where it flourished. In 1869—70 he was instrumental in getting the Oregon and California Railroad to locate its line through the area. Settlemier then platted out four blocks and offered a lot free to anyone who would erect a building. A community began to form and a city charter was adopted in 1895. J. H. Settlemier, long the unofficial leader of the community, became the first official mayor of Woodburn.

The J. H. Settlemier house is currently owned by the French Prairie Historical Society. The rooms are furnished with period pieces and with items associated with the French Prairie area. A collection of photographs illustrating the early history of the area is on display in the attic, and the Society is building a library of taped lectures on local historical topics.

Woodburn today is a community of middle-income housing developments sprawling rapidly across the flat fertile farmlands of the Willamette Valley. The town lacks a sense of cohesiveness or a clearly identifiable nucleus. The Settlemier house is a fine example of late ninteenth century architecture, though not an exceptional one by national standards. Yet it is the crowning jewel in a small neighborhood of houses contemporary with it, and assists greatly in providing an identifiable focus or historical prospective of Woodburn's organization and growth. It aids in providing a sense of stability and continuity in a somewhat disorganized community.

The house is in good condition and is being well-maintained. It is open for public inspection on a limited basis and is available for weddings, teas, receptions, meetings, and community oriented functions. The French Prairie Historical Society is active and has developed an energetic series of programs to acquaint citizens with the background of their community.
