DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pearre-Metcalfe House is located on Albaugh Road approximately one mile south of Maryland Route 31 in Frederick County. A brick structure built in the mid-nineteenth century, this farmhouse is an example of the Greek Revival style influence in central Maryland rural architecture.

Two stories with a T-shape plan, this brick house is built on a fieldstone foundation that is constructed into a slight slope. The five-bay main facade is at the top of the slope and faces east. This facade is laid in all stretcher bond with a central doorway and a one-story, one-bay entrance porch. The porch has a gable roof with a dentil and molded cornice that returns slightly at the corners. The porch roof is supported by fluted columns that have plain Doric capitals. The doorway has a transom and sidelights with mullions arranged to form an alternating pattern of panes. There are pilaster strips with plain, flat capitals between the sidelights The door is ornamented by paneled surround and a molded, and the door. flat, wood lintel. This lintel design is repeated over the windows throughout the house. The central bay on the second story of the main facade has a four-over-four sash window with two-over-two sash sidelights. The other windows on the main facade and the windows in the two-story gable ends are four-over-four sash with a wide, reeded, vertical mullion and thin horizontal members. In the gables are round-arch attic windows. Interior end brick chimney stacks rise on both sides of the roof ridge, connected above the ridge by a brick hyphen at each gable end of the main section. Α single chimney stack is on the gable end of the rear wing. There is a wood dentil cornice on the main facade and on the sides of the rear wing. Also on both sides of the rear wing are inset double-tier porches. A full basement exists on the south side of the wing because of the sloped site.

The interior of the main section is two rooms deep with a central hallway (see floor plan sketch). However, the stair hall does not extend the full length of the house, thus creating an irregular plan in which the space behind the stair hall becomes part of the southwest room. The first story of the rear wing houses the kitchen.

As with the exterior, the wood ornamentation of the interior provides a unique character to the house. The central hallway has cyma molded doorframes, a molded cornice and a staircase with an avoid handrail, square balusters and scroll bracket stair ends. The parlor has overpanels in the doorframes with stylized half-acanthus relief in the corners -- a pattern which is repeated on the interior window lintels of this room. The wood mantel in the parlor has an exagerated acanthus relief above reeded halfcolumns, which flank a half-elliptical central body. The mantel in the southeast room has reeded half-columns supporting an upper section of rectangular forms and naturalistic carving. The wood door and nobled window frames vary throughout the house. The upstairs trim, however, is more plain in design, e.g., the upstairs mantel design is reduced to large forms and shapes. The second-story northeast room has an original wood mantel painted to imitate marble.

The only outbuilding on the property is a small, brick springhouse with corbelled brick cornice and tin roof.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The mid-nineteenth century Pearre-Metcalfe house is an example of the typical central Maryland farmhouse form but with variations in plan and ornamentation. The basic form is a five-by-two bay, two-story brick structure with interior gable end chimney stacks. The perimeter of the floor plan is also representative of the region with its rectangular main section and a central wing on the rear, but there is an asymmetrical layout of rooms because the central stair hall does not run the full length A rural interpretation of the Greek Revival style is of the main section. found in the ornamentation of the house. The Greek Revival elements of the main facade include the plain stretcher bond, the dentil cornice, the gable roof entrance porch, the flat, horizontally molded wood lintels, and the window mullions which emphasize the square window panes. The builder has used architectural ideas prevalent during the mid-nineteenth century to give the main facade a blockish, monumental quality, but the retention of the farmhouse characteristics intrude upon this impression. The interior ornamentation, which varies from room to room, also derives from contemporary sources and stands apart from the restrained ornamentation and symmetrical facade characteristic of the central Maryland farmhouse.

The house is built on a tract of land called "Pearre's Retreat" and "Addition to Pearre's Retreat." The Pearre family had large landholdings in this region. According to local tradition, this house was built in 1859 by John R. Stevens for his daughter who married Hickson Pearre. One of the roof rafters has "Built 1859 Francis L. Biefdler," written in white paint. The property remained in the Pearre family until 1923. The current owner purchased it in 1961.

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BOUNDARY EXPLANATION

The boundary as drawn for the Pearre-Metcalf house includes the house, springhouse, and entrance drive. The springhouse is located 300 feet southwest of the house. The rear (west) boundary was drawn paralleling the road and far enough behind the house to include the springhouse. The south boundary was also drawn to include the springhouse. The north and south boundaries both parallel the drive to include the approach to the house which, along with the building itself, is on a slight rise. The northwest boundary was determined by where the west and north lines, mentioned above, intersect.
