211 Riverview Drives 1885 Jacob Berni Houses

Part of Lot 5, Albertson's Block, commencing at a point 3184/5 feet North 20 degrees west of the corner post north of G. Albertson's house, thence South 65 degrees West to center of the Alma Durand road and from the same point of beginning, 150 links or 99 feet North 25 degrees West to line between Lots 1. & 2 in Section 2 Township 21 North of Range 13 West thence along this line to the center of said road, the western boundary of this lot is the center of the Alma Durand road.

Jecob Berni was the son of Joseph Berni, one of the first three settlers; of Twelve Mile Bluff as Alma was known in 1849 when Joseph arrived from Salanc. Jacob grow up in Alma and when older began working for the Mississippi River Logging Company at Beef Slough. Part of his position there involved working as a dropper, the person who catches the stray log floating down the river, brings thems back to the clough to be put into a raft again. He obstinued working for the Mississippi River Logging Company for 27 years. He built this house for his mother Margaretha and his family, he having married Emma, the daughter of Charles Furrer, the line kill operator in 1883. They resided in this house for 14 years. The house still retains its original appearance with the front porch and attached shed to the south covered with white clapboard and the rest of the house brick veneered. The four over four windows are segmentally arched and the roof is gabled with dormers.
