in NW corner of parlor and has  
access from both rooms. House  
is unaltered and contains fine  
woodwork - beaded jambs, double (photos 4, 5)  
faced window trim, oval trim,  
beaded & pilastered ~~the~~ breakfast (photo 5)  
mantel, pegged panel doors with  
(photo 6) lift latches, chair railing, and paneled (photo 7)  
door presses in hall. Attic windows  
are taller than usual, lighting (photo 2)  
bedrooms there - 6 pane casements;  
1st floor has 9/6 dash. A frame ell  
and porch were added to the rear  
in 1941 and are in poor condition.

Behind the house is a stone dairy  
and 30 foot stone lined dug well.  
adjacent to the E corner of the yard  
is a cemetery with about a dozen graves,  
2 of which are "Sallie H. Nave, wife of  
R. P. Reynolds 1865-1899" and "Margaret  
Ann, wife of M. F. Logan 1823-1856"

House is on rise above surrounding  
farm of 1.35 acres, with cliffs descending  
to Ky R. on S at "Brooklyn". Rock faces  
line lane to tobacco barn.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A in the N corner of the yard, then with fence 150' and past corner 40' to B, then SW 40 ft, NW 40 ft and SW with fence 105' to C, then with fence NW 150' to D and NE 145' to the beginning, containing the stone house, dug well, stone dairy and cemetery: about 1/2 acre. No other early buildings on farm.
