Wa-B-123. This house is one of only several surviving Federal style structues in Bowling Green. It is an especially clear version of the single story, central passage plan house type popular in the Federal period in Kentucky. Most of the interior and exterior details have survived. The similar form and door detail of a house in the county (see Wa-133) make it likely that the same designer-builder worked on both houses. In addition, the house is the only nineteenth century structure on Main Street remaining to serve as a link between two historic districts, the Downtown Commercial District and St. Joseph's District.
