30. Brief statement of the property's history The campus of the Hinds County Agricultural High School consisted of four buildings - the Administration Building, a barn and two dormitories (Shangri-La and Main). This high school evolved into Hinds Junior College which is the largest junior college in Mississippi today. Sometime after 1925, Main's rear kitchen wing was removed and perpendicular pavilions were added to the short ends of the dormitory.

31. Brief description. If a thorough description has been prepared separately, disregard this section and check here □. Originally, this building was 13 bays wide. At an early date, two story, two bay wide pavilions were added to the ends of the building. The long gallery in the center of the front facade has a cornice. The entrance located in the porch area is flanked by sidelights and has a transom. The eight-over-eight double hung sash windows have stone lugsills. Those on the first floor also have brick soldier arches. A brick beltcourse runs below the gutters. The building is topped by a parapet with coping.
