

18. Description <p>The Eustace Williams house is a one-and-one-half story bungalow which draws upon a variety of architectural styles for its decorative motifs. Half-timbering embellishes the stuccoed exterior of the residence, while numerous gables and dormers enliven the red tile roof. A multi-paned bay window projects from the south facade, adjacent to the transomed entry.</p>		29. He was a reporter and editor for Louisville newspapers and, later, the secretary of the Kentucky State Highway Commission.
