girder ceiling. An additional bedroom and bathroom were added in unfinished storage space on the second floor in 1977.

The house is architecturally significant because is is one of a group of stone masonry houses built by Arnold F. Meyer & COmpany, Inc. according to Ernest Flagg's methods of construction. It is also significant because it is similar in plan to a house illustrated on plate 26 in Flagg's book on small houses. This house was built for Rufus Arndt, a draftsman in the Meyer office.
