Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Idaho State University Neighborhood Historic District is a residential area of twelve full blocks and parts of thirteen blocks. Roughly bounded by East Carter and East Center streets, the alley between South Sixth and South Fifth streets, and the alley between South Eighth and South Ninth streets, the district lies north of the Idaho State University campus and south of Pocatello's east side commercial district. The area is quite level, but a few blocks south and east of the district there are steep hills. The district streetscape achieved its current appearance by about 1942. Streets are relatively narrow (60 feet wide) and they are laid out in a grid pattern. Along them, houses are set back behind parking strips planted with mature deciduous shade trees, concrete sidewalks, and front lawns, usually level and often retaining their original plantings of hardy shrubs and trees. The majority of district houses face out along the numbered streets, between four and eight to a block. Along the named streets, a few houses occupy the interior of lots; many of these represent infill during the later development Behind most of the houses and set along the alleys are autoof the district. mobile garages dating from the late 1910's and sometimes later. There are also a few sheds in the backyards of the district. While most of the district conforms to a consistent setback from the street and lot sidelines, it is not unusual to see a district house set close to or even looking out on an alley. district is more densely settled than are most Idaho residential neighborhoods. Adding to the density of settlement are a few apartment buildings. The district also has two neighborhood grocery stores on Eighth Street, one church, and the one- block Caldwell Park, which is planted with mature spruce and fir trees and a variety of deciduous shade trees. Caldwell Park is the one major open space in the district.

The district is characterized by a variety of residential styles scattered throughout the neighborhood. From about 1900 to 1915 houses were built with reference to the Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Prairie, and bungalow styles. The Colonial Revival style was by far the most common, and the other three styles appear most often as influences in primarily Colonial buildings. Between 1915 and 1929 the Colonial Revival, bungalow, and Prairie styles were equally popular, and fully realized renditions of the latter two styles were built. Between 1929 and 1942 the Colonial Revival style continued its popularity, and a substantial number of houses were executed in that style scattered throughout the district, filling in lots that had been vacant. Dominating this period of infill building, however, was the English Cottage or Tudoresque style. Two other period revival styles, the Mission and Pueblo, and the Moderne style are represented in one or two examples built during the pre-World War II era.

In spite of its stylistic eclecticism, the district has a coherent streetscape that is the product of consistency in scale, massing, proportions, materials, and siting. About three-quarters of the district houses are frame, and the remaining quarter are brick, with the exception of seven houses built of stucco in combination with frame or brick and one concrete block house. Only a few of the houses are more than one and one-half stories, and no building in the district rises above two and one-half stories. Predominantly small scale and gable-roofed, most

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Idaho State University Neighborhood Historic District is significant as an area representing city expansion and architectural styles and types popular during the period 1900 through 1942. The district is the city's least altered residential area from the first half of this century. Its buildings and streets retain a feeling of the period through the preservation of street and sidewalk patterns; building materials, color, ornamentation, massing, and proportions; and original or early plantings. The district is associated with an important period of growth for Pocatello after the opening of reservation lands, a period in which the city grew into a major transportation, industrial, and educational center for the southeast Idaho region.



of the houses, whatever their style, have standard size double-hung sash windows. The high frequency of brick buildings in the district, especially as used in the Colonial, Prairie, and English cottage styles, is another unifying feature. Although styles are clearly expressed, much of the architecture is modern and unelaborate. The district does include a few outstanding buildings (see sites 28, 38, 40, 42, 79, 81, 125, 128, 129, 132, 133, 137, 181, 186, 192, 193, 198, 203, 243, 248, 248, 250, and 252) that are individually significant as excellent examples of their style, as locally rare examples of a style, or as examples of excellent workmanship and design.

Buildings have been assessed as contributory to the district primarily on the basis of their age and their degree of alteration. Buildings constructed after about 1942 are few. By that time the last of the Colonial Revival and English cottage houses were built and few vacant lots remained in the neighborhood. In addition, construction slackened with the beginning of World War II. Consequently, the few post-World War II houses in the district were built several years later and clearly represent the post-war housing industry dominated by the Ranch style. These buildings should eventually be assessed in relationship to their counterparts elsewhere in Pocatello, where whole neighborhoods of brick or frame Ranch houses were built in the late 1940's and 1950's.

The most frequent alteration to district buildings is re-siding with aluminum or stucco. In most cases residing a building was seen to render it non-contributory because the new siding obscured or caused the removal of defining features of building's style. With the Queen Anne style, in which surface texture itself is a defining feature, re-siding always affects the building's status. With other styles re-siding affects the building's status when it involves the removal or covering of window moldings, brackets, eave treatments, porch ornamentation, and so forth. In some cases, however, aluminum re-siding covers only a building's clapboard siding, and those buildings have been considered contributory.

Other alterations to district buildings include changes in the placement and types of windows, enclosure of porches, side or rear additions, and reroofing. For the most part the last two changes do not affect the status of a building, especially if additions are small and located on a lesser facade and if roofing materials are compatible with other original materials. Changes in fenestration were considered quite serious if windows on major facades were relocated or reglazed, and if the majority of a building's original windows had been lost. Some porch enclosures are compatible in materials and scale and leave a building's other major features intact.

The district's many garages are remarkably intact. Small, frame buildings with gable roofs and double doors set in one end wall, they generally retain their original siding and window and door openings, if any. A few were built with a distinctive notched and pedimented parapet above the usual double doors.

The Idaho State University neighborhood had little or no settlement before 1902. when the Academy of Idaho (later Idaho State University) was built at the end of Seventh Avenue on Carter. The academy site was chosen partly because it had the advantage of being outside the existing residential and business areas. photographs show the new academy building (no longer extant) surrounded by sagebrush. Before the building could go up, Seventh Avenue required grading. at least scattered settlement had occurred. That year the city council voted against putting sidewalks along Lewis Street between Second and Ninth, its reason being that only five houses were present along the seven-block stretch. same time, the council approved crosswalks connecting Fourth and fifth streets near the Presbyterian Church (no longer extant). A photograph taken of Seventh Avenue in about 1906 shows scattered houses along dirt roads, young trees planted in parking strips, sidewalks running in front of a few properties, and the academy building centered at the end of the avenue. According to Robert L. Wrigley, "even by 1910 the houses in this section were widely spaced with large areas of open (Wrigley, p. 94) The earliest Sanborn fire insurance map depicting the district was published in 1915. By that time the area surrounding the academy had a good density of frame dwellings and a few brick buildings, nearly all of them one story. By 1921 the area was densely developed, and by 1948 residential development had filled in the available lots in the district and spread beyond it east to Fourteenth Avenue and south to Terry Street. In 1942 Wrigley characterized the district as "the largest area of fine residences in Pocatello. Although one finds a number of second and third class residences scattered here and there the great majority of houses in this section are very attractive with beautiful surroundings." (Wrigley, p. 31)

The district is bounded on the north and west by commercial development. south it is bounded by the Idaho State University campus, whose buildings presently represent the university's major period of expansion from the mid-1940's through the early 1960's. The east boundary of the district is drawn to exclude houses built later than the district's developmental period and to exclude largely altered buldings and streetscapes dominated by a high percentage of altered noncontributory or merely compatible buildings, which become more frequent east of the district. Boundaries are drawn to extend east and west along the named sidestreets where there are contributory buildings or streetscapes. Nearly all of the district buildings retain their original use, the major reuse being the remodeling of houses into apartments. The two neighborhood stores in the district were stores within the district's period of significance, one being an early remodeling of a residence (the Woods Grocery) and the other having been built as a grocery designed in a compatible residential style (the Cottage Food Store). buildings have been lost from the district, but many have been remodeled in various ways, fortunately leaving most of them still contributory to the district (see the discussion of alterations, above). Over the past few years Pocatellans have shown an increased interest in restoring their historic buildings. Currently an historic preservation ordinance is before the city council, and a citywide survey of historic buildings that will be a basis for preservation components in the city's comprehensive plan is being conducted.

The establishment of a state academy at Pocatello in 1901 spurred the development of a major residential district on the east side of the city contiguous to the Apparently the area was uninhabited until the academy began, academy location. previous residential settlement being confined chiefly to west of the railroad Merrill Beal describes the journey from the center of town (only about ten blocks distance) to campus "over the board walk that crossed the tracks, [past] the Pacific Hotel and the Tupper House, thence into the intervening area of sage brush and sand to the Academy" (Beal, p. 10) The district grew, slowly at first and then more rapidly through the 1910's and 1920's, to become the city's Many of the town leaders, including businessmen, most prestigious neighborhood. doctors, lawyers, and professors at the new institution, built substantial and stylish homes in the vicinity of the academy after its founding. In particular, Seventh Avenue acquired a number of the larger and more elaborate houses, a treelined streetscape that culminated in a view of the first academy building (named Swanson Hall, no longer extant), located where Seventh Avenue terminates at Carter As discussed in part 7 of this nomination, by 1942 the district was formed as we see it now. Nearly all of the available lots were full, and a brief lull in building activity occurred during World War II. By the end of the war, the Colonial Revival and English Cottage styles had run their course; the few additional houses built in the neighborhood represent post-war tract housing ideas and are non-contributory.

The district grew up during four decades of major development for the city of Pocatello. Established as a railroad junction in 1882, the town was isolated and limited in its expansion by the surrounding Shoshoni-Bannock reservation until parts of the reservation were relinquished to white settlement in 1889 and 1900. During the years from 1900 to about 1942 the downtown area grew into a substantial commercial center for southeast Idaho, focused around the Oregon Short Line (Union Pacific) railroad shops, freight and passenger depots, and the nearby wholesale warehouse district. The state academy became a branch of the University of Idaho, serving the southeast Idaho region, and later a university in its own right. The town established itself as a permanent settlement, replicating along Midwestern patterns a grid of paved streets running parallel to the railroad tracks that split the city east and west, a concentrated commercial core of brick business blocks, and irrigated residential areas.


The Idaho State University neighborhood represents Pocatello settlement during the first half of the twentieth century as a major area of residential development during the period. In comparison with the other period neighborhoods in Pocatello, the area has the greatest concentration of unaltered buildings and the least altered and most elaborate representatives of the various popular styles. The district conveys a sense of its period through the presence of original plantings and through the siting of buildings, as well as through the presence of unaltered houses. In addition, most of the non-contributory houses are compatible with contributory buildings in scale, material, and color, making the streetscape a coherent one.


Southeastern Idaho has a high percentage of Idaho's Prairie-style houses. The Pocatello district provides an excellent range of examples in brick and frame that would support a study of the Prairie style in Idaho. In other ways as well, the district is an excellent representative of architectural trends in its region. The Colonial Revival style is dominant until quite late in the period, the bungalow is an important mode for the rapid construction of middle-class housing, and the English cottage is an important style for infill building during the Depression years. Not surprisingly, building in Pocatello slackened in the 1930's, but in contrast with many agriculturally based Idaho towns, industrially based Pocatello's construction did not slacken greatly during the 1920's.

As detailed in part 7 of this nomination, district boundaries are drawn to include the resources representing the period 1900 to 1942 and to exclude contiguous areas of more highly altered residential buildings, more recent residential buildings, commercial buildings, and the Idaho State University campus.
