

Description

This simple, one-room school house stands abandoned in an extremely rural White County community known as Lone Star. Situated east of Big Mingo Creek, in a large field amidst several trees, the school is neglected and deteriorating; however, it has not been altered since its construction in the 1920's and its architectural detailing remains intact.

The distinctively vernacular structure is rectangular, one story high, and covered with its original novelty siding. Its gable roof is covered in metal. The east and west elevations each include three double-hung, four-over-four sash windows, and a wooden door allowing access to the interior is located on each of the building's gable ends along the north and south elevations. The school also contains a central interior chimney constructed of brick, and the pier foundation is made of brick as well. The interior walls are covered in beaded board.

Significance

Because it is an intact and unaltered example of school house vernacular architecture from the era between World War I and the Depression, the Lone Star School is locally significant under National Register Criterion C for illustrating building practices traditional to an area during a particular period. As stated in Historic Context 3: Railroad Era, and Historic Context 4: Boom and Bust Era, vernacular architecture was common in all regions of the county, but primarily so in small, rural communities where the goal was to establish inexpensive and expedient housing. For residents of tiny Lone Star, the mere fact that they were able to provide a school building for their children was a sign of a more progressive period with a great potential for growth and development - a potential that, unfortunately, was cut short by the onset of the Depression.


