Henderson of Pueblo for#construction of coursed stone on a concrete foundation. The two-story building is symetrical in plan with a central pedimented wing extending 8 feet to either side on the north and south facades. The hipped roof is intersected on the rear facade by a matching pedimented gable. A 90-foot square tower extension, surmounted by a pyramidal roof and finial, rises from the center of the main facade. Romanesque arches are used predominately at second floor level suggesting, to gether with the visual heaviness of the building, an adaptation of the Romanesque style so popular in Colorado commercial m architecture at the beginning of the 20th century. An open porch, supported by stone cclumns, forms a balcony m at second floor level in the tower section. The two-story, coursed stone jail, adjacent to the Court House building, features a square tower centered on the main facade rising to a crested, hipped roof. Huerfano County was created by the First Territorial Legislature in 1861 with the settlement of Autobees Plaza designated as county seat. Later, the town of Badito was selected as county seat and in 1874, the county seat was again moved, this time to Walsenburg, a colorful more promising settlement incorporated in 1873 on the site of La Plaza de los Leones, a primitive Hispano settlement.

The Huerfano County Courthouse was built at Walsenburg 30 years later during a sudden period of prosperity resulting from accelerated coal mining activity in the area. As new mines opened, railroad spurs were built to serve the mines, new jobs were created and the economy was improved. Construction of an imposing new county court house, at the cost of \$35,000, served as a strong expression of both optimism and pride, which in turn inspired a general building boom throughout the area. The Huerfano County Courthouse stands 70 years later as a still-imposing Walsenburg architectural landmark symbolic of civic pride and reminiscent of an exciting period of regional prosperity.
